## SAN FERNANDO POLICE ANNOUNCE **"TORCH RUN" TO BENEFIT SPECIAL OLYMPICS**

San Fernando, CA – The San Fernando Police Department will again participate in the Law Enforcement Torch Run for the Special Olympics of Southern California Summer Games. On Wednesday, June 7, 2017, the team of Police Officers and City personnel will run side-by-side with both Special Olympic Athletes and Los Angeles School Police and will accept the "Flame of Hope" Torch from the Los Angeles Police Department Mission Division Team.

The torch will be carried throughout the City of San Fernando and the 1.8 mile route will start at approximately 9:20 am.


