SAN FERNANDO POLICE ANNOUNCE "TORCH RUN" TO BENEFIT SPECIAL OLYMPICS

San Fernando, CA – The San Fernando Police Department will participate for the first time this year in having a team of officers run in the Law Enforcement Torch Run for the Special Olympics of Southern California Summer Games on Wednesday, June 8, 2016. At approximately 9:20 am, officers and personnel of the San Fernando Police Department, side by side with Special Olympic athletes, will accept the "Flame of Hope" Torch from the Los Angeles Police Department Mission Station officers and carry it throughout the City of San Fernando.

The run will begin on the street at Mott Street and Chatsworth Drive (at O'Melveny Elementary School) and finish at 700 San Fernando Road in front of Rydell Auto Dealership. The runners will proceed from the school on Mott Street to Brand Boulevard, north to the City's Civic Center, first passing the San Fernando Middle School, then the Court House on Third Street and then into the Civic Center, pass City Hall and the Police Station, and then proceed to the San Fernando Mall entering from San Fernando Mission Boulevard, and then end at 700 San Fernando Road at about 10 am, running a total 1.8 miles, passing the Torch to LAPD's Foothill Station officers.

The Flame of Hope symbolizes courage and celebration of diversity that represents the spirit of the Special Olympics. This Flame of Hope will be used to light the cauldron at the Special Olympics Southern California Summer Games this summer at Cal State University of Long beach to be held on June 11, 2016 and June 12, 2016.
