SUBJECT: Warrant Register

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the City Council approve the attached Warrant Register.

BACKGROUND:

For each City Council meeting the Finance Department prepares a Warrant Register for Council approval. The Register includes all recommended payments for the City and the Successor Agency to the San Fernando Redevelopment Agency. The Agency warrants are also reflected on the Agency Consent Calendar to reimburse the City for expenses included on the City's Register. Checks, other than handwritten checks, generally are not released until after the Council approves the Register. The exceptions are for early releases to avoid penalties and interest, excessive delays and in all other circumstances favorable to the City to do so. Handwritten checks are those payments required to be issued between Council meetings such as insurance premiums and tax deposits. Staff reviews requests for expenditures for budgetary approval and then prepares a Warrant Register for Council approval and or ratification. Items such as payroll withholding tax deposits do not require budget approval.

The Deputy Finance Director hereby certifies that all requests for expenditures have been signed by the department head, or designee, receiving the merchandise or services thereby stating that the items or services have been received and that the resulting expenditure is appropriate. The Deputy Finance Director hereby certifies that each warrant has been reviewed for completeness and that sufficient funds are available for payment of the warrant register.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the City Council:

- a. Adopt a Resolution (Attachment "A") approving City participation in the ICRMA Crime Insurance Program; and
- b. Approve an ICRMA-sponsored crime insurance policy coverage of all City officers and employees under one master bond.

BACKGROUND:

- 1. Prior to January 1, 1997, the California Government Code required that local public agency treasurers be individually bonded. Additionally, the City Council also had the authority to require bonds of other officers or employees.
- 2. Per the City Municipal Code, the City is required to secure a bond for the City Treasurer, the City Clerk, and the Finance Director on an annual basis.
- 3. In January 1997, California Government Code Section 1481 was amended to extend master bonding provisions to local public agencies.
- 4. On June 13, 2012, the ICRMA Governing Board approved the establishment of the ICRMA Crime Insurance Program for member cities to be effective July 1, 2012. The program provides blanket coverage for dishonest acts of employees (embezzlement, fraudulent transfer of funds, theft of cash), forgery or alteration, computer fraud, fund transfer fraud, and outside premise robbery.

Resolution Approving City Participation in the Independent Cities Risk Management Authority (ICRMA) Crime Insurance Program Page 2

ANALYSIS:

Comparison of the City's current crime/bond coverage limits, deductibles, and premiums with the ICRMA group purchase program shows significant benefits and cost savings under the group purchase program.

The City's current crime/bond policy has a coverage limit of \$150,000 with a \$2,500 deductible and an annual premium of \$908 for just three positions. The positions include the City Treasurer, the City Clerk and the Finance Director.

The ICRMA blanket coverage is a preferred and more cost-efficient way that secures a master bond for all officials and employees rather than just three positions. The policy also has a more comprehensive coverage limit of \$1,000,000, as well as a \$5,000 deductible. The annual premium is \$838.

CONCLUSION:

Approval of the attached Resolution is necessary for the City to participate in the ICRMA Crime Insurance Program, and cover all officers and employees under one master bond.

BUDGET IMPACT:

There is a projected savings of approximately 8.5% plus increased coverage and limits under the group purchase program.

BACKGROUND:

- 1. On March 19, 2012, representatives of the City and San Fernando Police Officers Association (SFPOA) concluded negotiations for changes in wages and other terms and conditions of employment, and reached a tentative agreement on all items.
- 2. On April 10, 2012, the City Administrator was officially advised that the general membership of the SFPOA is in agreement with all the items tentatively agreed to during the negotiations.
- 3. On April 30, 2012, staff received the actuarial valuation from the California Public Employees' Retirement System (CalPERS) specifying the cost of adopting a new 3% @ 55 Full Retirement Formula for new sworn police hires.
- 4. On May 7, 2012, the City Council approved the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the City and SFPOA.
- On June 26, 2012, CalPERS made available the relevant documents required by the City to amend it's contract with CalPERS in order to provide a different level of retirement benefit (3% @ 55 Full Retirement Formula) for new sworn police hires.

ANALYSIS:

The MOU approved by the City Council on May 7, 2012, includes a provision to amend the City's contract with CalPERS to implement a new 3% @ 55 Full Retirement Formula. This will be the safety personnel third tier plan, and it shall apply to any new sworn police member first hired by the City after the effective date of this contract amendment. The first tier is under a 3% @ 50 Retirement Formula with single highest year compensation consideration, and includes sworn employees hired before January 6, 1994, while the second tier is also under a 3% @ 50 Retirement Formula, but with highest 36-month average compensation consideration, and includes sworn employees hired from January 6, 1994 through present.

CalPERS requires that a Resolution of Intention and an Ordinance be adopted to amend the City's contract with CalPERS in order to implement this benefit.

Below is the schedule recommended by CalPERS in order to implement this benefit, and meet the terms of the MOU with SFPOA:

CONCLUSION:

Amendment of the City's contract with CalPERS is necessary to enable the City meet the terms of the negotiated MOU with SFPOA.

BUDGET IMPACT:

According to CalPERS' actuarial valuation, the employer contribution rate for new hires under the 3% @ 55 Formula will be 20.057% of reportable earnings for local police members entering membership for the first time in the police classification after the effective date of this amendment to contract.

The employer contribution rate for employees under the safety first tier is 40.474%, while the rate for employees under the safety second tier is 24.723%.

- WHEREAS, the following is a statement of the proposed change:

To provide Section 20475 (Different Level of Benefits). Section 21363.1 (3% @ 55 Full formula) is applicable to local police members entering membership for the first time in the police classification after the effective date of this amendment to contract.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the governing body of the above agency does hereby give notice of intention to approve an amendment to the contract between said public agency and the Board of Administration of the Public Employees' Retirement System, a copy of said amendment being attached hereto, as an "Exhibit" and by this reference made a part hereof.



The Board of Administration, California Public Employees' Retirement System, hereinafter referred to as Board, and the governing body of the above public agency, hereinafter referred to as Public Agency, having entered into a contract effective October 1, 1946, and witnessed October 25, 1946, and as amended effective April 1, 1952, February 1, 1956, July 16, 1965, January 6, 1973, November 26, 1983, June 22, 1985, June 21, 1986, July 1, 1989, January 6, 1994, June 9, 1997, January 7, 1999, July 7, 1999, June 30, 2001, September 7, 2002, February 5, 2005 and November 12, 2005 which provides for participation of Public Agency in said System, Board and Public Agency hereby agree as follows:

- A. Paragraphs 1 through 14 are hereby stricken from said contract as executed effective November 12, 2005, and hereby replaced by the following paragraphs numbered 1 through 17 inclusive:
 - 1. All words and terms used herein which are defined in the Public Employees' Retirement Law shall have the meaning as defined therein unless otherwise specifically provided. "Normal retirement age" shall mean age 60 for local miscellaneous members entering membership in the miscellaneous classification on or prior to November 12, 2005, age 55 for local miscellaneous members entering membership for the first time in the miscellaneous classification after November 12, 2005, age 50 for local police members entering membership in the police classification on or prior to the effective date of this amendment to contract, age 55 for local fire members and for those local police members entering membership for the first time in the first time in the police classification after the effective date of this amendment to contract, age 55 for local fire members and for those local police members entering membership for the first time in the police classification after the effective date of this amendment to contract.

- 2. Public Agency shall participate in the Public Employees' Retirement System from and after October 1, 1946 making its employees as hereinafter provided, members of said System subject to all provisions of the Public Employees' Retirement Law except such as apply only on election of a contracting agency and are not provided for herein and to all amendments to said Law hereafter enacted except those, which by express provisions thereof, apply only on the election of a contracting agency.
- 3. Public Agency agrees to indemnify, defend and hold harmless the California Public Employees' Retirement System (CalPERS) and its trustees, agents and employees, the CalPERS Board of Administration, and the California Public Employees' Retirement Fund from any claims, demands, actions, losses, liabilities, damages, judgments, expenses and costs, including but not limited to interest, penalties and attorneys fees that may arise as a result of any of the following:
 - (a) Public Agency's election to provide retirement benefits, provisions or formulas under this Contract that are different than the retirement benefits, provisions or formulas provided under the Public Agency's prior non-CalPERS retirement program.
 - (b) Public Agency's election to amend this Contract to provide retirement benefits, provisions or formulas that are different than existing retirement benefits, provisions or formulas.
 - (c) Public Agency's agreement with a third party other than CalPERS to provide retirement benefits, provisions, or formulas that are different than the retirement benefits, provisions or formulas provided under this Contract and provided for under the California Public Employees' Retirement Law.
 - (d) Public Agency's election to file for bankruptcy under Chapter 9 (commencing with section 901) of Title 11 of the United States Bankruptcy Code and/or Public Agency's election to reject this Contract with the CalPERS Board of Administration pursuant to section 365, of Title 11, of the United States Bankruptcy Code or any similar provision of law.
 - (e) Public Agency's election to assign this Contract without the prior written consent of the CalPERS' Board of Administration.
 - (f) The termination of this Contract either voluntarily by request of Public Agency or involuntarily pursuant to the Public Employees' Retirement Law.

- (g) Changes sponsored by Public Agency in existing retirement benefits, provisions or formulas made as a result of amendments, additions or deletions to California statute or to the California Constitution.
- 4. Employees of Public Agency in the following classes shall become members of said Retirement System except such in each such class as are excluded by law or this agreement:
 - a. Local Fire Fighters (herein referred to as local safety members);
 - b. Local Police Officers (herein referred to as local safety members);
 - c. Employees other than local safety members (herein referred to as local miscellaneous members).
- 5. In addition to the classes of employees excluded from membership by said Retirement Law, the following classes of employees shall not become members of said Retirement System:

NO ADDITIONAL EXCLUSIONS

- 6. Public Agency and the San Fernando Redevelopment Agency have agreed to a merger of their contracts, and this contract shall be a continuation of the benefits of the contract of the San Fernando Redevelopment Agency, pursuant to Section 20567.5 of the Government Code. Such merger is effective as of June 22, 1985. Legislation repealed said Section effective January 1, 1988.
- 7. The percentage of final compensation to be provided for each year of credited prior and current service for local miscellaneous members in employment before and not on or after September 7, 2002 shall be determined in accordance with Section 21354 of said Retirement Law, subject to the reduction provided therein for service on and after January 1, 1960, the effective date of Social Security coverage, for members whose service has been included in Federal Social Security (2% at age 55 Full and Modified).
- 8. The percentage of final compensation to be provided for each year of credited prior and current service for local miscellaneous members in employment on or after September 7, 2002 and not entering membership for the first time in the miscellaneous classification after November 12, 2005 shall be determined in accordance with Section 21354.3 of said Retirement Law, subject to the reduction provided therein for service on and after January 1, 1960, the effective date of Social Security coverage, for members whose service has been included in Federal Social Security (3% at age 60 Full and Modified).

- 9. The percentage of final compensation to be provided for each year of credited current service as a local miscellaneous member entering membership for the first time in the miscellaneous classification after November 12, 2005 shall be determined in accordance with Section 21354 of said Retirement Law subject to the reduction provided therein for Federal Social Security (2% at age 55 Modified).
- 10. The percentage of final compensation to be provided for each year of credited prior and current service as a local fire member shall be determined in accordance with Section 21366 of said Retirement Law (One-half pay at age 55 Full).
- 11. The percentage of final compensation to be provided for each year of credited prior and current service as a local police member entering membership in the police classification on or prior to the effective date of this amendment to contract shall be determined in accordance with Section 21362.2 of said Retirement Law (3% at age 50 Full).
- 12. The percentage of final compensation to be provided for each year of credited current service as a local police member entering membership for the first time in the police classification after the effective date of this amendment to contract shall be determined in accordance with Section 21363.1 of said Retirement Law (3% at age 55 Full).
- 13. Public Agency elected and elects to be subject to the following optional provisions:
 - a. Section 21571 (Basic Level of 1959 Survivor Benefits) for local fire members only.
 - b. Section 21574 (Fourth Level of 1959 Survivor Benefits) for local police members and local miscellaneous members only.
 - c. Section 21335 (5% Cost-of-Living Allowance, base year 1982) for those local police members entering membership on or prior to January 6, 1994, Section 21335 (5% Cost-of-Living Allowance, base year 2002) for those local miscellaneous members entering membership on or prior to November 12, 2005 and Section 21335 (3% Cost-of-Living Allowance, base year 2005) for those local miscellaneous members entering membership after November 12, 2005.
 - d. Section 20042 (One-Year Final Compensation) for those local police members entering membership on or prior to January 16, 1994 and local miscellaneous members.
 - e. Section 21024 (Military Service Credit as Public Service) for local miscellaneous members and local police members only.

- f. Section 20965 (Credit for Unused Sick Leave) for local miscellaneous members only.
- g. Section 21548 (Pre-Retirement Option 2W Death Benefit) for local safety members only.
- h. Section 20475 (Different Level of Benefits). Section 20037 (Three-Year Final Compensation) and Section 21329 (2% Annual Cost-of-Living Allowance Increase) are applicable to local police members entering membership for the first time in the police classification after January 6, 1994.

Section 21354 (2% @ 55 Modified formula) and Section 21335 (3% Annual Cost-of-Living Allowance Increase) are applicable to local miscellaneous members entering membership for the first time in the miscellaneous classification after November 12, 2005.

Section 21363.1 (3% @ 55 Full formula) is applicable to local police members entering membership for the first time in the police classification after the effective date of this amendment to contract.

- 14. Public Agency shall contribute to said Retirement System the contributions determined by actuarial valuations of prior and future service liability with respect to local miscellaneous members and local safety members of said Retirement System.
- 15. Public Agency shall also contribute to said Retirement System as follows:
 - a. Contributions required per covered member on account of the 1959 Survivor Benefits provided under Section 21574 of said Retirement Law. (Subject to annual change.) In addition, all assets and liabilities of Public Agency and its employees shall be pooled in a single account, based on term insurance rates, for survivors of all local miscellaneous members and local police members.
 - b. A reasonable amount, as fixed by the Board, payable in one installment within 60 days of date of contract to cover the costs of administering said System as it affects the employees of Public Agency, not including the costs of special valuations or of the periodic investigation and valuations required by law.
 - c. A reasonable amount, as fixed by the Board, payable in one installment as the occasions arise, to cover the costs of special valuations on account of employees of Public Agency, and costs of the periodic investigation and valuations required by law.

- 16. Contributions required of Public Agency and its employees shall be subject to adjustment by Board on account of amendments to the Public Employees' Retirement Law, and on account of the experience under the Retirement System as determined by the periodic investigation and valuation required by said Retirement Law.
- 17. Contributions required of Public Agency and its employees shall be paid by Public Agency to the Retirement System within fifteen days after the end of the period to which said contributions refer or as may be prescribed by Board regulation. If more or less than the correct amount of contributions is paid for any period, proper adjustment shall be made in connection with subsequent remittances. Adjustments on account of errors in contributions required of any employee may be made by direct payments between the employee and the Board.



The Board of Administration, California Public Employees' Retirement System, hereinafter referred to as Board, and the governing body of the above public agency, hereinafter referred to as Public Agency, having entered into a contract effective October 1, 1946, and witnessed October 25, 1946, and as amended effective April 1, 1952, February 1, 1956, July 16, 1965, January 6, 1973, November 26, 1983, June 22, 1985, June 21, 1986, July 1, 1989, January 6, 1994, June 9, 1997, January 7, 1999, July 7, 1999, June 30, 2001, September 7, 2002, February 5, 2005 and November 12, 2005 which provides for participation of Public Agency in said System, Board and Public Agency hereby agree as follows:

- A. Paragraphs 1 through 14 are hereby stricken from said contract as executed effective November 12, 2005, and hereby replaced by the following paragraphs numbered 1 through 17 inclusive:
 - 1. All words and terms used herein which are defined in the Public Employees' Retirement Law shall have the meaning as defined therein unless otherwise specifically provided. "Normal retirement age" shall mean age 60 for local miscellaneous members entering membership in the miscellaneous classification on or prior to November 12, 2005, age 55 for local miscellaneous members entering membership for the first time in the miscellaneous classification after November 12, 2005, age 50 for local police members entering membership in the police classification on or prior to the effective date of this amendment to contract, age 55 for local fire members and for those local police members entering membership for the first time in the first time in the police classification after the effective date of this amendment to contract, age 55 for local fire members and for those local police members entering membership for the first time in the police classification after the effective date of this amendment to contract.

- 2. Public Agency shall participate in the Public Employees' Retirement System from and after October 1, 1946 making its employees as hereinafter provided, members of said System subject to all provisions of the Public Employees' Retirement Law except such as apply only on election of a contracting agency and are not provided for herein and to all amendments to said Law hereafter enacted except those, which by express provisions thereof, apply only on the election of a contracting agency.
- 3. Public Agency agrees to indemnify, defend and hold harmless the California Public Employees' Retirement System (CalPERS) and its trustees, agents and employees, the CalPERS Board of Administration, and the California Public Employees' Retirement Fund from any claims, demands, actions, losses, liabilities, damages, judgments, expenses and costs, including but not limited to interest, penalties and attorneys fees that may arise as a result of any of the following:
 - (a) Public Agency's election to provide retirement benefits, provisions or formulas under this Contract that are different than the retirement benefits, provisions or formulas provided under the Public Agency's prior non-CalPERS retirement program.
 - (b) Public Agency's election to amend this Contract to provide retirement benefits, provisions or formulas that are different than existing retirement benefits, provisions or formulas.
 - (c) Public Agency's agreement with a third party other than CalPERS to provide retirement benefits, provisions, or formulas that are different than the retirement benefits, provisions or formulas provided under this Contract and provided for under the California Public Employees' Retirement Law.
 - (d) Public Agency's election to file for bankruptcy under Chapter 9 (commencing with section 901) of Title 11 of the United States Bankruptcy Code and/or Public Agency's election to reject this Contract with the CalPERS Board of Administration pursuant to section 365, of Title 11, of the United States Bankruptcy Code or any similar provision of law.
 - (e) Public Agency's election to assign this Contract without the prior written consent of the CalPERS' Board of Administration.
 - (f) The termination of this Contract either voluntarily by request of Public Agency or involuntarily pursuant to the Public Employees' Retirement Law.

- (g) Changes sponsored by Public Agency in existing retirement benefits, provisions or formulas made as a result of amendments, additions or deletions to California statute or to the California Constitution.
- 4. Employees of Public Agency in the following classes shall become members of said Retirement System except such in each such class as are excluded by law or this agreement:
 - a. Local Fire Fighters (herein referred to as local safety members);
 - b. Local Police Officers (herein referred to as local safety members);
 - c. Employees other than local safety members (herein referred to as local miscellaneous members).
- 5. In addition to the classes of employees excluded from membership by said Retirement Law, the following classes of employees shall not become members of said Retirement System:

NO ADDITIONAL EXCLUSIONS

- 6. Public Agency and the San Fernando Redevelopment Agency have agreed to a merger of their contracts, and this contract shall be a continuation of the benefits of the contract of the San Fernando Redevelopment Agency, pursuant to Section 20567.5 of the Government Code. Such merger is effective as of June 22, 1985. Legislation repealed said Section effective January 1, 1988.
- 7. The percentage of final compensation to be provided for each year of credited prior and current service for local miscellaneous members in employment before and not on or after September 7, 2002 shall be determined in accordance with Section 21354 of said Retirement Law, subject to the reduction provided therein for service on and after January 1, 1960, the effective date of Social Security coverage, for members whose service has been included in Federal Social Security (2% at age 55 Full and Modified).
- 8. The percentage of final compensation to be provided for each year of credited prior and current service for local miscellaneous members in employment on or after September 7, 2002 and not entering membership for the first time in the miscellaneous classification after November 12, 2005 shall be determined in accordance with Section 21354.3 of said Retirement Law, subject to the reduction provided therein for service on and after January 1, 1960, the effective date of Social Security coverage, for members whose service has been included in Federal Social Security (3% at age 60 Full and Modified).

- 9. The percentage of final compensation to be provided for each year of credited current service as a local miscellaneous member entering membership for the first time in the miscellaneous classification after November 12, 2005 shall be determined in accordance with Section 21354 of said Retirement Law subject to the reduction provided therein for Federal Social Security (2% at age 55 Modified).
- 10. The percentage of final compensation to be provided for each year of credited prior and current service as a local fire member shall be determined in accordance with Section 21366 of said Retirement Law (One-half pay at age 55 Full).
- 11. The percentage of final compensation to be provided for each year of credited prior and current service as a local police member entering membership in the police classification on or prior to the effective date of this amendment to contract shall be determined in accordance with Section 21362.2 of said Retirement Law (3% at age 50 Full).
- 12. The percentage of final compensation to be provided for each year of credited current service as a local police member entering membership for the first time in the police classification after the effective date of this amendment to contract shall be determined in accordance with Section 21363.1 of said Retirement Law (3% at age 55 Full).
- 13. Public Agency elected and elects to be subject to the following optional provisions:
 - a. Section 21571 (Basic Level of 1959 Survivor Benefits) for local fire members only.
 - b. Section 21574 (Fourth Level of 1959 Survivor Benefits) for local police members and local miscellaneous members only.
 - c. Section 21335 (5% Cost-of-Living Allowance, base year 1982) for those local police members entering membership on or prior to January 6, 1994, Section 21335 (5% Cost-of-Living Allowance, base year 2002) for those local miscellaneous members entering membership on or prior to November 12, 2005 and Section 21335 (3% Cost-of-Living Allowance, base year 2005) for those local miscellaneous members entering membership after November 12, 2005.
 - d. Section 20042 (One-Year Final Compensation) for those local police members entering membership on or prior to January 16, 1994 and local miscellaneous members.
 - e. Section 21024 (Military Service Credit as Public Service) for local miscellaneous members and local police members only.

- f. Section 20965 (Credit for Unused Sick Leave) for local miscellaneous members only.
- g. Section 21548 (Pre-Retirement Option 2W Death Benefit) for local safety members only.
- h. Section 20475 (Different Level of Benefits). Section 20037 (Three-Year Final Compensation) and Section 21329 (2% Annual Cost-of-Living Allowance Increase) are applicable to local police members entering membership for the first time in the police classification after January 6, 1994.

Section 21354 (2% @ 55 Modified formula) and Section 21335 (3% Annual Cost-of-Living Allowance Increase) are applicable to local miscellaneous members entering membership for the first time in the miscellaneous classification after November 12, 2005.

Section 21363.1 (3% @ 55 Full formula) is applicable to local police members entering membership for the first time in the police classification after the effective date of this amendment to contract.

- 14. Public Agency shall contribute to said Retirement System the contributions determined by actuarial valuations of prior and future service liability with respect to local miscellaneous members and local safety members of said Retirement System.
- 15. Public Agency shall also contribute to said Retirement System as follows:
 - a. Contributions required per covered member on account of the 1959 Survivor Benefits provided under Section 21574 of said Retirement Law. (Subject to annual change.) In addition, all assets and liabilities of Public Agency and its employees shall be pooled in a single account, based on term insurance rates, for survivors of all local miscellaneous members and local police members.
 - b. A reasonable amount, as fixed by the Board, payable in one installment within 60 days of date of contract to cover the costs of administering said System as it affects the employees of Public Agency, not including the costs of special valuations or of the periodic investigation and valuations required by law.
 - c. A reasonable amount, as fixed by the Board, payable in one installment as the occasions arise, to cover the costs of special valuations on account of employees of Public Agency, and costs of the periodic investigation and valuations required by law.

- 16. Contributions required of Public Agency and its employees shall be subject to adjustment by Board on account of amendments to the Public Employees' Retirement Law, and on account of the experience under the Retirement System as determined by the periodic investigation and valuation required by said Retirement Law.
- 17. Contributions required of Public Agency and its employees shall be paid by Public Agency to the Retirement System within fifteen days after the end of the period to which said contributions refer or as may be prescribed by Board regulation. If more or less than the correct amount of contributions is paid for any period, proper adjustment shall be made in connection with subsequent remittances. Adjustments on account of errors in contributions required of any employee may be made by direct payments between the employee and the Board.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the City Council adopt a Resolution (Attachment "A") calling a Special Municipal Election to fill the vacant position of a City Councilmember and consolidating said Election with the Recall Election of Mario F. Hernández; requesting that the County Board of Supervisors consolidate the Election with the Statewide General Election to be held on November 6, 2012 and that the County Registrar perform certain election services in connection with said Special Election; and authorizing the City Administrator to reimburse the County for election services.

BACKGROUND:

On July 10, 2012, Councilmember Hernández submitted his resignation from the City Council, effective July 6, 2012. Pursuant to the provisions of the Government Code, when a vacancy occurs, the council shall, either fill the vacancy by appointment, or call a Special Election to fill the vacancy. A person appointed or elected to fill a vacancy holds office for the unexpired term of the former incumbent. Under the instant circumstances, the individual who is either appointed, or elected to Councilmember Hernández's seat, will hold office until the certification of the March 2013 General Municipal Election.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN FERNANDO, CALIFORNIA, CALLING A SPECIAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION TO FILL THE VACANT POSITION OF A CITY COUNCIL MEMBER AND CONSOLIDATING SAID ELECTION WITH THE RECALL ELECTION OF MARIO F. HERNÁNDEZ; REQUESTING THAT THE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS CONSOLIDATE THE ELECTION WITH THE STATEWIDE GENERAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON NOVEMBER 6, 2012 AND THAT THE COUNTY REGISTRAR PERFORM CERTAIN ELECTION SERVICES IN CONNECTION WITH SAID SPECIAL ELECTION; AND AUTHORIZING THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR TO REIMBURSE THE COUNTY FOR ELECTION SERVICES

WHEREAS, the position of City Councilmember became vacant upon the resignation of Mario F. Hernández, received by the City on July 10, 2012, with an effective date of July 6, 2012; and

WHEREAS, the position of City Councilmember is an elected position in the City of San Fernando, and the term of the incumbent shall expire in March 2013; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 36512 of the Government Code, when a vacancy occurs in the office of City Councilmember, the City Council may appoint an individual to fill the vacancy or call a special election to fill the vacancy; and

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to comply with the requirements of the Government Code in the event of a vacancy on the City Council, and desires to call a special election to fill said vacancy; and

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to have the Los Angeles County Registrar of Voters render certain services in connection with the election; and

WHEREAS, the office of Mario F. Hernández is also subject to recall on November 6, 2012. In an effort to conserve public resources, the individual who wins the most votes in the special recall election for the office of Mario F. Hernández, notwithstanding whether the recall is successful, shall also be the successor in the special election to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of Mario F. Hernández.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of San Fernando as follows:

SECTION 1. The City Council hereby calls a special municipal election to be held on November 6, 2012, to fill the vacant position of City Councilmember and to consolidate that special election with the special recall election of Mario F. Hernández. The winner of the special recall

election shall be elected to fill the remainder of Mario F. Hernández's term on the City Council.

SECTION 2. Pursuant to Sections 10400 and 10403 of the California Elections Code, the City Council of the City of San Fernando hereby requests that the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors direct the Registrar of Voters to conduct all necessary services related to the special municipal election, and to bill the City for the costs of conducting said election.

SECTION 3. The timing of the submission of nomination documents for candidates shall be governed by Section 10407 of the California Elections Code and submitted to the office of the City Clerk no later than 5:00 p.m. 88 days prior to the date of the special election, which is August 10, 2012. Nomination documents shall be available in the office of the City Clerk during the hours that City Hall is normally open to the public.

SECTION 4. Candidate statements shall not exceed 200 words and shall be submitted to the office of the City Clerk with nominating documents, as required by Section 13307 of the California Elections Code.

SECTION 5. The office of the City Clerk is hereby directed to file a certified copy of this resolution with the Board of Supervisors and the Registrar of Voters of Los Angeles County.

<u>SECTION 6.</u> The City Administrator is hereby authorized to reimburse Los Angeles County in full for such services actually performed upon presentation of a bill from the County.

SECTION 7. Notice of the time and place of holding the election is hereby given and the office of the City Clerk is authorized, instructed and directed to give further or additional notice of the election, in time, form and manner as required by law.

SECTION 8. As permitted by Section 13307 of the Elections Code, all candidates shall be required to pay in advance and simultaneously with the submission of a candidate statement his or her estimated pro rata share of the cost of printing, handling, translating, and mailing the candidate statement. A candidate who submits a statement and qualifies as indigent under Section 13309 of the Elections Code shall not be required to pay his or her pro rata share of the cost of printing, handling, translating, and mailing the statement until after the election. The City Clerk is authorized to requirement payment in any reasonable form deemed appropriate to ensure collection.

SECTION 9. The City Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of this Resolution and it shall thereupon take effect.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the City Council:

- Adopt a Resolution (Attachment "A") accepting the City Clerk's Certification of Results of Examination of Signatures on Recall Petitions for Councilmembers Brenda Esqueda, Mario F. Hernández, and Maribel De La Torre; and
- b. Adopt a Resolution (Attachment "B") Calling and Giving Notice of a Special Municipal Election on November 6, 2012; and
- c. Adopt a Resolution (Attachment "C") Requesting that the Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles Consolidate the City of San Fernando's Special Municipal Election with the Statewide General Election on November 6, 2012.

BACKGROUND:

- 1. On January 26, 2012, proponents filed with the City Clerk's office Notices of Intention to Circulate Recall Petitions (Petitions) for Councilmembers Brenda Esqueda, Mario F. Hernández, and Maribel De La Torre.
- 2. On February 7, 2012, the proponents submitted proofs of publication of the Notices of Intent along with two blank copies of the Petitions for each Councilmember. Per the Elections Code, the Petitions must be reviewed and approved for circulation by the City Clerk.

Adoption of Resolutions Regarding City Clerk Certification of Recall Petition Signatures, Giving Notice of Calling a Special Municipal Election, and Requesting the Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles to Consolidate with the General Election on November 6, 2012 Page 2

- 3. On February 16, 2012, the City Clerk notified the proponents that the three Recall Petitions formats failed to meet certain requirements of the Elections Code and that the proponents had 10 days to file two blank copies of the corrected Petitions.
- 4. On February 17, 2012, the proponents filed two blank copies of the revised Petitions for each Councilmember.
- 5. On February 23, 2012, the City Clerk notified the proponents that Petition formats met the requirements of the Elections Code. Proponents were notified that they had 90 days (i.e., until May 23, 2012) to file the Petitions and that the number of signatures required, in order to qualify a recall for the ballot, was 2,029 (equal to 25% of the total number of registered voters in the City).
- 6. On May 21, 2012, the City Clerk received Petitions for the Recall of Councilmembers Brenda Esqueda (340 pages with 2,787 signatures); Mario F. Hernández (343 pages with 2,816 signatures); and Maribel De La Torre (344 pages with 2,825 signatures). On their face, the total number of signatures affixed to the Petitions exceeded the minimum number of signatures required and the three Petitions were accepted for filing.

On this same day, the City Clerk delivered the three Petitions to the County of Los Angeles Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk's (RR/CC) office and requested signature verification for <u>all</u> signatures (including the circulator's) on each page/section of the Petitions.

7. On July 2, 2012, the RR/CC notified the City Clerk that there were 2,347 valid signatures for Councilmember Esqueda; 2,398 valid signatures for Councilmember Hernández; and 2,373 valid signatures for Councilmember De La Torre.

The City Clerk announced that the Recall Petitions for San Fernando City Councilmembers Brenda Esqueda, Mario F. Hernández, and Maribel De La Torre had sufficient signatures to qualify for a Recall Election. Per the state Elections Code, the City Clerk is required to execute a Certificate of Sufficiency and notify the proponents of the results. The Certificates of Sufficiency must then be submitted to the City Council.

8. On July 10, 2012, Councilmember Hernández submitted his resignation from the City Council, effective July 6, 2012. Pursuant to the provisions of the Government Code, when a vacancy occurs, the Council shall, either fill the vacancy by appointment, or call a special election to fill the vacancy. A person appointed or elected to fill a vacancy holds office for the unexpired term of the former incumbent. Under the instant circumstances, the individual who is either appointed, or elected to Councilmember Hernández's seat, will hold office until the certification of the March 2013 General Municipal Election.

ANALYSIS:

Because the number of valid signatures on the Recall Petitions exceed the number required for validity, the City Clerk has declared the Petitions sufficient and recommends that the City Council receive and file the Certificates of Sufficiency of Recall Petitions for Councilmembers Brenda Esqueda, Mario F. Hernández, and Maribel De La Torre.

Election Date

Pursuant to State law, the Special Municipal Election must be consolidated with the Statewide General Election held on November 6, 2012.

Elections Code § 11242 states:

The election shall be held not less than 88, nor more than 125, days after the issuance of the order, and if a regular or special election is to be held throughout the electoral jurisdiction of the officer sought to be recalled within this time period, the recall election shall be held on the same day, and consolidated with, the regular or special election.

Although the City Council has 14 days from the meeting at which it receives the Certificates of Sufficiency to call the election, it should be noted that July 30, 2012, also falls within the 88-125 day timeframe (i.e., November 6, 2012, election date will not change).

Ballot and Sample Ballot

The ballot will include:

- 1. The question to recall the officer; and
- 2. (a) The names of the candidates nominated to succeed the officer sought to be recalled; and (b) write-in spaces.

A majority of the votes must be "Yes" for a recall to prevail. If the officer is recalled, the candidate receiving the highest number of votes for the office shall be declared elected for the unexpired term of the recalled officer.

The sample ballot will include: 1) the grounds for recall as submitted by the proponents; 2) the officer's answer to the recall as submitted by the officer; 3) the candidates' statements (for candidates to replace a recalled officer); and 4) a candidates statements (for the officers subject to the recall).

The County will publish all notices, issue vote-by-mail ballots, mail sample ballots, hire poll workers, determine polling places, canvass and certify the election results. The City Clerk's office will handle the nomination papers and candidate statements.

Nomination Papers and Candidate Statements

The nomination papers shall be issued by the City Clerk after the passage of the Resolution calling the election and filed no less than **75** days prior to the election.

No person whose recall is being sought may be a candidate to succeed himself or herself at a recall election nor to succeed any other member of the same governing board whose recall is being sought at the same election.

Nominations of candidates to succeed the recalled officer shall be made in the manner prescribed for nominating a candidate to that office in a regular election.

Nomination papers shall be issued to a specific candidate "for the office of Member of the City Council to succeed (name of the officer to be recalled)".

Resignation of Councilmember Mario F. Hernandez

Per the Elections Code, the recall election will proceed. The vacancy can be filled as set forth above.

BUDGET IMPACT:

The FY 2011-12 Budget included \$10,000, RR/CC signature verification services, and the FY 2012-13 Budget includes \$50,000 for conducting the Special Election. It is estimated that if the City were to run the Special Election itself, the total cost, would be approximately \$60,000.

The County has provided the City with an estimate of \$33,000; thus, consolidating the Special Municipal Election with the Statewide General Election would create a savings of approximately \$17,000 to the FY 2012-13 General Fund Budget.
