

COVID-19 VACCINE ELIGIBILITY: Primary, Additional, and Booster Doses

- 1 The Pfizer vaccine for children is a different formulation. Children 5-11 years of age get a vaccine with a smaller dose (1/3rd the dose that teens and adults receive).
- 2 Moderna doses vary. The primary series and the additional (3rd) dose are a full dose. The booster dose is a half dose.
- 3 Additional dose The CDC recommends that <u>moderately to severely immunocompromised people</u> who received an mRNA vaccine (Pfizer or Moderna) as their primary series receive an additional (3rd) dose. The additional dose should be the same COVID-19 vaccine as their primary series. Talk to your doctor about the need to get an additional dose of COVID-19 vaccine and ask about the best timing based on your current treatment plan. *Note*: if you are immunocompromised and received the J&J vaccine for your primary series, you should get a booster dose.
- 4 **Booster doses.** You may choose which vaccine you receive as a booster dose. It can be a booster dose of Pfizer, Moderna, or J&J COVID-19 vaccine. Talk to your doctor if you have questions about the risks and benefits of a booster or about which vaccine to get as a booster.
- **5** If you are immunocompromised, this will be 6 months after your additional (3rd) dose.
