Eduardo Solorzano, LAUSD Community Schools Administrator, provided an update on the efforts to keep students safe. Chair Zobel-Rodriguez reported that Julian Reyes is no longer with Republic, Councilmember Pacheco will be sponsoring a \$1000 nursing scholarship, former Mayor Fajardo is also on board, and the Jerry's Kids scholarship will stay on the same time line.

The Veterans Recognition Program is currently accepting applications for the 2022 display period. City Council has made a generous donation to cover the application fee for 2022.

In partnership with Tree People, a volunteer restoration day will be held at Rudy Ortega Park on December 11th. Registration is available on the City website.

**BACKGROUND:**

1. On July 28, 2020, the Education Commission approved the 2020 – 2021 Student of the Month Program with the following categories:

  - d. November – Giving Back
  - e. December/January – Leadership
  - f. February – Kindness / Caring (Allies)

  - i. May – Academic Achievement
2. In November 2021, Student of the Month applications were released to City of San Fernando schools to allow school staff to nominate students for the months of December 2021 and January 2022.

**RECOMMENDATION:**

It is recommended that the Education Commission:

- a. Discuss and review the scholarship donation letter (Attachment “A”);
- b. Discuss the Scholarship fund balance (Attachment “B”) and set an award amount for each of the scholarships being awarded;
- c. Discuss and provide direction on how to manage inquiries on the scholarship program ; and
- d. Discuss and provide direction for compiling the submitted essays for the Commissions’ review.

**BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS:**

The San Fernando Education Commission (Commission) was established on May 5, 2011, and acts as the liaison between City and local schools’ administrations, the City’s local board administrators for the Los Angeles Unified School District, and other public and private schools that operate in the City. The Annual Student Scholarship Essay Contest Program was formed to assist youths who are seeking higher education learning opportunities.

The Scholarship Program has grown from two scholarships to eight scholarships awarded annually. Scholarships are funded through generous donations from various donor sources, including but not limited to current/former Councilmembers, organizations such as Independent Cities Finance Authority (ICFA), and Republic Services. The current scholarship fund balances are included as Attachment “B”.

The Student Scholarship Program opportunities for FY 2021-2022 are briefly described in the scholarship flyer that can be accessed through the City’s webpage at <https://ci.san-fernando.ca.us/commissions-boards/#education>. The current scholarships being offered include:

Gabriel Fernandez Memorial Scholarship  
Elias Rodriguez Memorial Scholarship  
Pahola Mascorro – Why Not You? Scholarship  
Nursing and Healthcare Scholarship  
Environmental Sustainability Scholarship  
Unheard Voices Scholarship  
Gerry’s Kids Scholarship  
Republic Services – César Chávez Scholarship

The current scholarship balance is \$6,410. The breakdown of the available funds of each scholarship is listed in Attachment “B”. Staff is not aware of any new donations that have been deposited to the program. Staff is recommending that the Education Commission set the award amount for each of the scholarships offered for the 2021-2022 cycle.

The Education Commission recognizes that the scholarships are funded through generous donations and the Commission is aware that these donations are not a yearly assurance by the funding donor. Hence, the Commission has taken a proactive stance and drafted a letter highlighting the goals of the scholarship program and soliciting donations. A review of the donation letter will take place at the January 25<sup>th</sup> Commission meeting. The recommended edits will be incorporated into the final draft of the donation letter before it is circulated.

The Recreation and Community Services (RCS) Department has recently assumed liaison and support duties for the Education Commission. As Department staff familiarizes themselves with the procedures of the Education Commission, staff requests discussion and direction on two procedural matters of the 2021-2022 Student Scholarship Program. First, RCS staff has fielded questions regarding the scholarship program. Unfortunately, staff could not answer specific questions due to some ambiguity regarding the eligibility. Staff recommends that a procedure be established for answering inquiries to the public.

Secondly, RCS staff seeks direction for compiling the scholarship essays received. It is staff’s understanding that there is a blind review of the essays. Staff will need access to the application platform and the timeline for compiling the essay review and awarding the scholarships.

**BUDGET IMPACT:**

There is no fiscal impact with the discussion of this item. Additional future costs are to be determined based on the Education Commissions’ recommendations.

**CONCLUSION:**

It is recommended that the Education Commission discuss and review the scholarship donation letter, review the scholarship fund balance and set award amounts, discuss and direct how scholarship inquiries are managed, and discuss the compiling of the essay review.

## San Fernando Education Commission 2022 Student Scholarship Program Fact Sheet

**Purpose of Scholarship Program Introduction:** To share the importance of the city scholarship program intended for the students of our city; to inspire businesses, community organizations and individual people to continue the funding of established city scholarships; or if desired, to create new meaningful scholarships to be administered through the City of San Fernando Education Commission.

**Goal:** To sustain and enhance the scholarship program with adequate funding for present and future use

### History of Awarded Scholarships:

- 2022 is the 7<sup>th</sup> year of the scholarship program
- Scholarships are funded by San Fernando City Council Members, private businesses and private donors
- The award amounts available depend on donated funds provided in any given year
- There are several types of scholarships which have been funded these past years
- Previous scholarship recipients have used their awards to help with transportation, meals, textbooks, housing and other college costs

### In House Procedures:

- Advertise scholarship availability on the City of San Fernando website and by hard copy flyer distribution to the high schools located within the city and through additional outreach efforts to the students/youths who live in the city but may attend other local schools
- Application is available on-line
- Students respond by submitting an application which includes a writing prompt reflective of the type of scholarship requested
- Collect submitted applications per yearly timeline
- Applications are read and scored blindly by a team of Commissioners searching for the best qualities of essay content
- A rubric and scoring sheet are used to guide a group discussion on the top 5 scoring essays. A winner is selected for the available scholarships.
- Winner and one/two guests are invited to an award reception (other design may be used in different circumstances)
- Scholarship donors and school representatives are also invited to be present

## City of San Fernando Education Commission 2022 Student Scholarship Program Introduction

On behalf of the City of San Fernando Education Commission, we would like to introduce you to the student scholarship program supporting the youth of the city. The Annual Student Scholarship Essay Contest Program was formed to assist deserving youths/students in San Fernando who are seeking postsecondary education opportunities. We are asking for your assistance and support.

Scholarship funds are received through generous donations by various donor sources such as current and former San Fernando Councilmembers, city staff, community organizations, private donors and businesses such as Republic Services. Every year we try to increase the amount of funds available for scholarships to award.

Did you know that the number one reason students cite for dropping out of college is the need to work long hours while attending school? Think about all of the costs that go along with tuition and fees: transportation, textbooks, room and board, a meal plan and more.
