

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

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PMMP Findings

- Many residential areas with high parking demand, on-street and offstreet
- Commercial areas with high demand, low parking space turnover
- Commercial and residential projections of Corridors Specific Plan increase demand by up to 30%
- Changes in commercial use may require adjustments to shared use parking, resulting in changes in parking standards
- Future Updates to PMMP document Verify commercial area demand patterns in post-COVID economy, validate and update recommendations
- Future parking supply potential funded through private or City sources





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Commercial Area Regulation Recommendations



- Provide more availability of parking spaces through management
- Promote turnover of spaces throughout the day
- Employee parking through permits or use of perimeter lots
- Adjust limits on metered spaces downtown, add time limits to close-in lots
- Adjust time limits on some blocks of Maclay

Potential Residential Parking Districts

- Areas of consistent high demand weekdays/weekends
- Within neighborhood areas, between major roadways
- Concept of 11 potential districts
- Providing framework for neighborhood-initiated implementation

Residential Permit Parking Program

<u>Initial:</u>

Adjustments to Residential Permit Program ordinance for easier establishment of districts, adjust fees to cover cost of permit issuance and implementation, establish petition process

Second phase:

Implement petition process, establish process for review, certification, data collection, community meeting, consensus, Council Resolution

Third phase:

Signage plan, administration of permit issuance, application process for residents, communications package for residents, permit request system, enforcement

Parking Demand Management

<u>Initial:</u>

Park once, downtown employee parking permit program, hire parking coordinator, develop shared parking program

Second Phase:

Pay by plate stations and/meters, adjust payment structure and mobile payment strategies, optimize loading zone use, San Fernando Trolley restart and expansion

Third Phase:

Remote parking as needed, review/expand electric vehicle charging stations to other lots and vehicle types, shared parking, free valet parking stations, remote parking, wayfinding and guidance



Parking Meter Technology

<u>Initial:</u>

Review parking industry pay stations and/or meters, replace outdated equipment

Second Phase:

Install Pay by Plate pay station and/or meters, adjust payment structure and mobile payment strategies, servicing, maintenance and collection, enforcement handhelds and software

Downtown Parking Pricing

Current pricing meets parking market of surrounding communities.

Future:


Develop pricing methodology for demand management, adjust rates at 85% peak occupancy

Pricing methodology - proximity to core demand areas to create turnover, price lots/structures for long-term parking needs

Potential for employee permits




What is the issue you commonly experience with on-street public parking (check all that apply)?






What times of day do you think should be restricted to permit-only parking in this neighborhood (check all that apply)?






