**Subject:** May 2023 Notable Police Department Events and Activities

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

It is recommended that the Transportation and Public Safety (TPS) Commission receive and file this informational report.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

Each month at the City of San Fernando Transportation and Public Safety Commission meeting, the San Fernando Police Department (SFPD) submits and provides the governing board a brief overview of the previous month's community engagement activities, noteworthy incidents, and proactive enforcement.

#### **ANALYSIS:**

The SFPD has recently heightened and further integrated its community profile in three major areas: Community Engagement, Proactive Enforcement and Quality of Life Enhancements.

For the month of May, the SFPD has the following activities and incidents to report:

#### **COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT:**

#### 1. Community Academy Culmination

The Community Academy concluded its session series in May. Community Academy participants learned about the different operational areas of the Police Department including the functions of the Patrol Bureau, Records Bureau, Reserve Police Officer Program, Police Explorer POST, Traffic Unit, and K-9 Unit. The SFPD will begin a new Community Academy session in the Fall 2023.

#### 2. Special Olympics Regional Swim Competition

The City of San Fernando hosted the 2023 Special Olympics Regional Swim Competition on May 13, 2023. Sworn and civilian members of the Police Department assisted with awarding medals to participating athletes.

#### 3. Neighborhood Watch Meeting

On Wednesday, May 17, 2023, the Police Department hosted its Monthly Neighborhood Watch Meeting. Police personnel responded to questions from the audience and discussed crime trends in San Fernando.

#### 4. Parole and Probation Compliance Operation

The SFPD conducted a Parole and Probation Compliance Operation in collaboration with the California Department Corrections and Rehabilitation on May 22, 2023. The compliance check was conducted, in part, to ensure individuals on parole were in compliance with their parole conditions. One individual was out of compliance and subsequently arrested.

#### 5. Alcohol Beverage Control Details

On May 9, 2023, SFPD Detectives conducted an ABC Minor Decoy Operation. During the operation, under-aged decoys were deployed at various off-sale licensee establishments (locations where alcohol is purchased for consumption off site) to ensure that the establishments were not selling alcohol to minors. Three adults received citations for selling alcohol to minors.

On May 18, 2023, the Police Department conducted Informed Merchants Preventing Alcohol-Related Crime Tendencies (IMPACT) inspections of on-sale licensed establishments.

Finally, on May 23, 2023, Detectives conducted a "Shoulder Tap Operation." During this operation, under-aged decoys contacted nine adult individuals outside various alcohol retailers and asked the individuals to purchase alcohol for them. Two adults supplied alcohol to the under-aged decoys at two separate locations. The adults received misdemeanor citations.

#### 6. Business Watch Meeting

The Police Department hosted its regular Business Watch Meeting on May 24, 2023. Topics of discussion included crime trend questions and issues of concerns for business owners.

#### 7. Chat-with-the-Chief

On May 25, 2023, Chief Valdez hosted his monthly Chat-with-the-Chief at the American Legion. Topics of discussion included current legislation impacting law enforcement, current crime trends, and the concerns of attendees.

#### 8. Open House

The Police Department hosted its Second Annual Open House on Memorial Day, May 29, 2023. Members of the community visited the Police Department and learned about its various specialties and divisions, including the K9 unit, Evidence, Firearms Training, and more. Over 150 members of the community attended the event.

#### 9. "Day in the Life"

The Police Department continues to host Film Director Timur Bootzin as he prepares to film a documentary highlighting the work of SFPD Officers and in the inner workings of the police department.

#### **NOTEWORTHY EVENTS:**

- 1. In May, SFPD Officers conducted multiple focused patrols in commercial areas throughout the City, the SF Mall, Bike Path, residential neighborhoods, and City Parks. Officers also conducted extra traffic details in the areas of Fourth Street and Orange Grove Avenue, the Mall District, Fifth Street and Arroyo Avenue, and Fifth Street and Fermoore.
- 2. On May 10, 2023 at about 3:40 PM, SFPD Officers initiated a traffic stop on an individual who was speeding and driving recklessly on a motorized scooter. The driver ran several red lights near Truman Street and South Workman Street, and then deliberately acted in a manner that presented a danger to other drivers. Officers attempted to initiate a traffic stop on the motorist and a pursuit ensued, ending when the suspect stopped on the 13000 block of Van Nuys Blvd. and fled on foot. The subject was later arrested without incident.
- 3. On May 11, 2023, at 6:45 AM, SFPD Community Service Officers responded to a call regarding illegally parked vehicles on Park Ave. Ten vehicles were cited and two were later stored.
- 4. On May 13, 2023, at approximately 9:22 AM, SFPD Officers responded to a shoplifting investigation on the 900 Block of San Fernando Road. The subject was later arrested.
- 5. On May 14, 2023, at approximately 11:04 AM, SFPD Officers responded to a call of a male subject yelling and making threats. The subject was later transported to Olive View Medical Center for a mental health evaluation.
- 6. On Sunday, May 28, 2023 at approximately 9AM, SFPD Officers were notified of a vandalism in progress at the intersection of Glenoaks Blvd and Harding Ave. The caller reported that the suspect was in a vehicle, driving to multiple locations and vandalizing the area with red spray paint. Officers spotted the suspect's vehicle at the 7-Eleven, located at N. Hubbard Ave. Officers observed the male suspect, 40 year-old Daniel Gutierrez of Sylmar; spray-painting the north wall of a local business. SFPD Officers contacted the male and determined that he had also vandalized six other locations within the City. Gutierrez was arrested and booked for

felony vandalism and is scheduled for arraignment on May 31 in San Fernando Court. He is being held in lieu of a \$20,000 bail.

#### **QUALITY OF LIFE ENHANCEMENTS:**

- 1. SFPD Det. J. Cervantes has started engagement with Community Development and Code Enforcement to address the bulky item concerns residents have brought up at recent community meetings.
- 2. On May 30, 2023, SFPD Community Service Officers responded to the area Morning Side Court and Brand Blvd. to address residents leaving trash bins and trash on the curb outside of permitted pick-up days.
