Subject: September 2024 Notable Police Department Events and Activities

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Transportation and Public Safety (TPS) Commission receive and file this informational report.

BACKGROUND:

Each month at the City of San Fernando Transportation and Public Safety Commission meeting, the Police Department submits and provides the governing board a brief overview of the previous month's community engagement activities, noteworthy incidents, and proactive enforcement.

ANALYSIS:

The San Fernando Police Department (SFPD) has recently heightened and further integrated its community profile in three major areas: Community Engagement, Proactive Enforcement and Quality of Life Enhancements.

For the month of September, 2024, the SFPD has the following activities and incidents to report:

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT:

1. Los Angeles Unified School District- "Safe Kids Alliance"

On Monday, September 9, 2024, Chief Fabian Valdez and Community Services and Recreations Director Julio Saucedo attended the "Safe Kids Alliance," which was a collaborative of representatives from different governmental agencies and non-profits to discuss synergizing different approaches to enhance student community safety.

2. Parent Meetings:

On Tuesday, September 17, 2024, and Wednesday, September 25, 2024, SFPD detectives and Command Staff met with school personnel and parents at San Fernando Middle School and SFiAM to discuss school safety.

3. **Neighborhood Watch Meeting:**

The monthly Neighborhood Watch meeting was held on Wednesday, September 18, 2024, at 6 PM, at Rudy Ortega Sr., Park, (Tea House). SFPD staff responded to questions and concerns of participants.

4. **Business Watch Meeting:**

The monthly Business Watch Meeting was held on Wednesday, September 25, 2024, at 12 PM in the City Council Chambers. SFPD staff responded to questions and concerns from participants.

NOTEWORTHY EVENTS:

1. On Monday, September 2, 2024, at about 9:20 AM, SFPD officers responded to a report of two subjects breaking into a locked storage box in the 12000 Block of Foothill Boulevard (The Home Depot). When the officers arrived on scene, the subjects fled, but were later arrested for burglary.
2. On Tuesday, September 3, 2024, around 7:44 PM, an SFPD officer responded to the police station for a report of a domestic incident. The officer spoke with a female and completed a Domestic Incident Report. About 45 minutes later, a male subject was observed on top of the female's vehicle in front of the police station. Additional officers arrived and detained the subject. Following an investigation, the female subject was arrested for domestic violence and the male subject was arrested for malicious mischief to a vehicle.
3. On Wednesday, September 4, 2024, at approximately 4:08 AM, SFPD officers responded to a report of a subject trespassing in the 2000 Block of Second Street. Upon arrival, officers reviewed video surveillance footage provided by the reporting party and observed a male subject tampering with a sprinkler in the reporting party's yard. The subject had also broken into a laundry room on the property. Officers conducted a search for the subject, who was located in the area of Hubbard Avenue and Herrick Street. The subject was later arrested for felony vandalism and possession of methamphetamine.
4. On Thursday, September 5, 2024, at about 2:44 PM, SFPD officers responded to a report of a vehicle colliding with a building near Ilex Street and Fox Street. During their investigation, officers learned that the individuals involved were possibly connected to a hit-and-run and assault with a deadly weapon in Los Angeles. LAPD was notified, and the two suspects were detained at the scene while LAPD handled the criminal investigation.

5. On Friday, September 6, 2024, around 7:17 AM, SFPD officers responded to a report of a vehicle blocking a driveway in the 1400 Block of Hewitt Street. Upon arrival, officers found the driver of the vehicle asleep behind the wheel. They observed that the driver displayed signs of alcohol intoxication. A DUI investigation was completed, and the driver was arrested for DUI.
6. On Friday, September 6, 2024, at approximately 11:24 PM, SFPD officers responded to a report of a male and female arguing near Truman Street and Hubbard Avenue, with the male holding a baby. Officers learned the male had an outstanding domestic violence warrant and arrested him. The officers also discovered that the couple was homeless, so they secured baby supplies from a local pharmacy and transported the mother and baby to a shelter near Devonshire Street and De Soto Avenue.
7. On Saturday, September 7, 2024, at about 10:42 PM, SFPD officers responded to a report of criminal threats involving a firearm in the 1200 Block of San Fernando Road. The reporting party provided a description of the suspect and the vehicle. Officers located the vehicle and detained the driver and two passengers. A search of the vehicle revealed a firearm. All three individuals were arrested on various firearm-related charges, and the vehicle was impounded.
8. On Sunday, September 8, 2024, at approximately 3:15 AM, SFPD officers conducted a traffic stop near San Fernando Mission Boulevard and San Fernando Road. The driver was found asleep at the wheel while the vehicle was stopped. After several attempts to wake him, officers detected a strong odor of alcohol. A DUI investigation was conducted, and the driver was arrested for driving under the influence. The vehicle was impounded.
9. On Monday, September 9, 2024, around 11:34 PM, SFPD officers responded to a traffic collision near Glenoaks Boulevard and Alexander Street. They discovered that the driver of the vehicle, which had struck a parked car, was under the influence of alcohol. The female driver was arrested for felony DUI.
10. On Tuesday, September 10, 2024, at approximately 10:13 AM, SFPD officers responded to a Flock ALPR alert of a stolen vehicle in the area of O'Melveny Avenue and San Fernando Mission Boulevard. Officers located the vehicle near Brand Boulevard and Nobel Street, conducted a high-risk traffic stop, and arrested two individuals for grand theft auto.
11. On Friday, September 13, 2024, at approximately 9:39 AM, SFPD officers located an unoccupied stolen vehicle in the 500 block of Hagar Street. Shortly after, they observed two female subjects enter the vehicle and drive away. Officers initiated a high-risk traffic stop and arrested one subject for outstanding warrants and the other for grand theft auto.
12. On Saturday, September 14, 2024, around 6:40 PM, SFPD Officers responded to a report of a burglary suspect located in the 600 Block of San Fernando Mission Boulevard. When officers

arrived at the scene, the suspect became physically combative. An adult male was arrested for burglary, violating a restraining order, and resisting an officer.

13. On Sunday, September 15, 2024, at approximately 9:11 PM, SFPD officers responded to a request for extra patrol at Target, located at 12920 Foothill Boulevard. The store's loss prevention officer reported that a known male subject was inside, placing items in his backpack. The suspect exited the store without paying for the items. SFPD officers contacted the subject and detained him for questioning. The subject was arrested for shoplifting.

14. On Monday, September 16, 2024, at around 6:00 PM, an SFPD officer received a FLOCK alert of a stolen vehicle traveling eastbound on San Fernando Road toward South Meyer Street. The officer located the vehicle in the 1600 block of San Fernando Road and initiated a traffic stop. Additional officers arrived to assist, but the driver fled on foot. After a brief foot pursuit, the subject was arrested for grand theft auto, resisting arrest, and driving with a suspended license.

15. On Wednesday, September 18, 2024, at approximately 7:41 PM, SFPD officers responded to a report of a residential fire in the 600 block of Hollister Street. Upon arrival, officers observed flames engulfing the rear of the house. LAFD arrived shortly after to extinguish the fire.

16. On Sunday, September 22, 2024, at approximately 12:35 AM, an SFPD officer observed a vehicle speeding in the area of Hubbard Street and Truman Street. The officer initiated a traffic stop and conducted an investigation. The driver was subsequently arrested for reckless driving, driving without a license, and an outstanding warrant from Fresno County for grand theft auto. The vehicle was impounded for 30 days

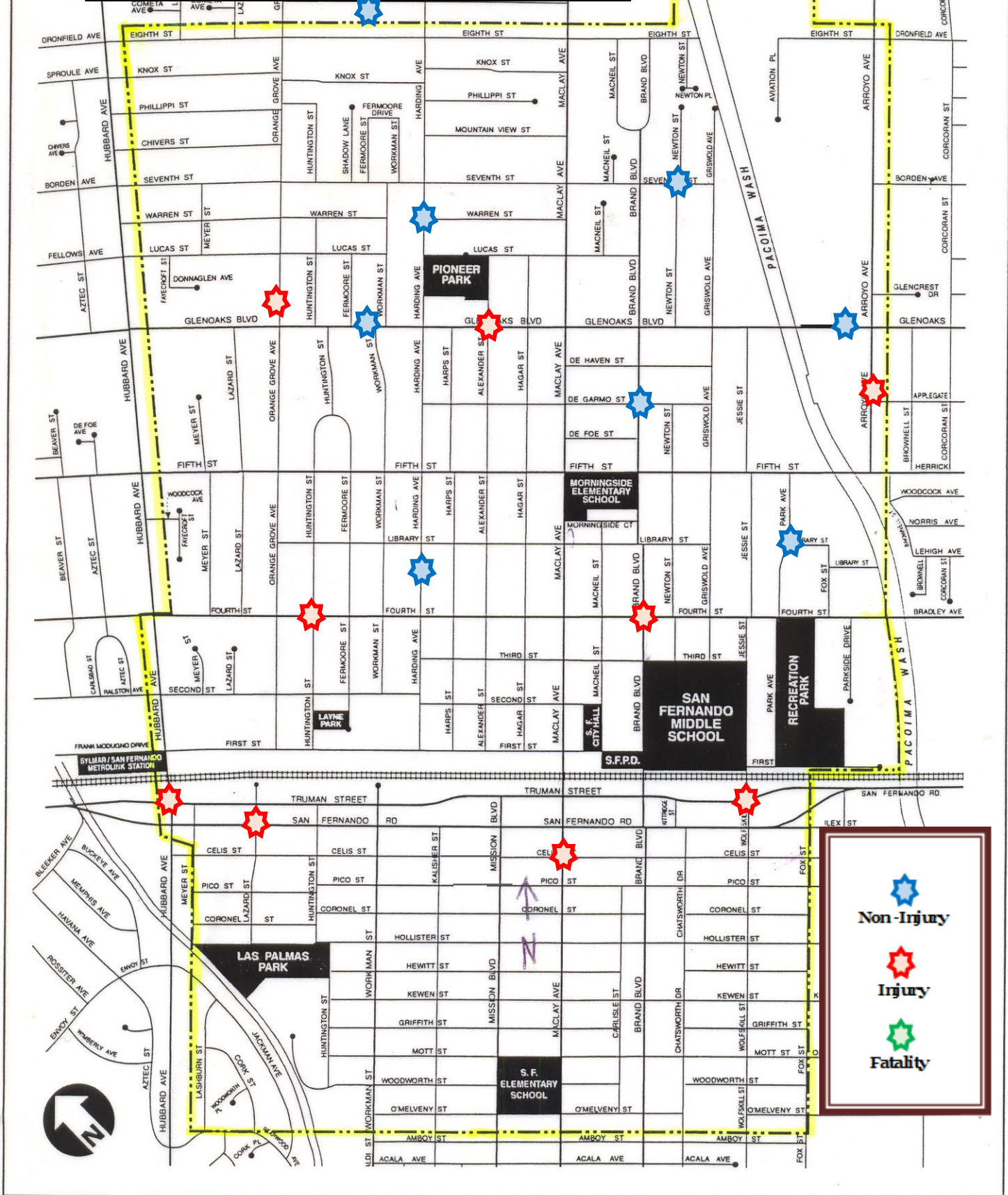
