Subject: October 2024 Notable Police Department Events and Activities

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Transportation and Public Safety (TPS) Commission receive and file this informational report.

BACKGROUND:

Each month at the City of San Fernando Transportation and Public Safety Commission meeting, the Police Department submits and provides the governing board a brief overview of the previous month's community engagement activities, noteworthy incidents, and proactive enforcement.

ANALYSIS:

The San Fernando Police Department (SFPD) has recently heightened and further integrated its community profile in three major areas: Community Engagement, Proactive Enforcement and Quality of Life Enhancements.

For the month of October 2024, the SFPD has the following activities and incidents to report:

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT:

1. National Night Out:

The 2024 National Night Out/Open House took place on Tuesday, October 1, 2024, in front of the San Fernando Police Station, located at 910 First Street, San Fernando. The event drew approximately 400 participants who visited community booths, and watched K9 and High-Risk Traffic Stop demonstrations. Additionally, around 200 participants toured the Station during the Open House.

2. School Safety Collaboration:

On Friday, October 4, 2024, at 9:00 AM, Detective Jorge Cervantes attended a meeting in Sun Valley with LAUSD personnel and Los Angeles School Police Command Staff to discuss a school safety collaboration between LAUSD, the Los Angeles School Police Department, and SFPD.

3. Neighborhood Watch Meeting:

The monthly Neighborhood Watch meeting was held on Wednesday, October 16, 2024, at 6 PM, in the San Fernando City Council Chambers. SFPD staff reviewed Part 1 crime statistics for September and responded to participants' questions and concerns.

4. Business Watch Meeting:

The monthly Business Watch Meeting was held on Wednesday, October 23, 2024, at 12 PM in the City Council Chambers. SFPD staff reviewed Part 1 Crime statistics for September and responded to participants' questions and concerns.

5. San Fernando Community Coalition to Prevent Gang Violence.

On Wednesday, October 23, 2024, at 1:30 PM, Chief Fabian Valdez, LAPD Command Staff, San Fernando City staff, local non-profits, and community stakeholders met at Recreation Park to network and discuss strategies on how to address the recent increase in gang activity.

NOTEWORTHY EVENTS:

1. On Thursday, October 3, 2024, around 8:07 PM, a SFPD Officer observed a reckless driver in the area of Fifth Street and Hagar Street. The officer initiated a traffic stop, but the driver failed to yield and instead parked in a driveway in the 500 Block of Hagar Street. Both the driver and a passenger exited the vehicle and fled on foot to a backhouse on the property. Additional officers arrived and knocked on the door of the backhouse. A male subject, appearing to be under the influence of alcohol, responded and admitted to driving the vehicle. After conducting field sobriety tests, officers arrested the subject for driving under the influence of alcohol, reckless driving, driving without a valid license, and driving with a blood alcohol content (BAC) of .08 or higher.
2. On Friday, October 4, 2024, at about 8:25 AM, SFPD Officers responded to a report of an individual brandishing a weapon in the area of Glenoaks Boulevard and Alexander Street. Following an investigation, one subject was arrested for brandishing a weapon or firearm, and another for providing false identification to a police officer.
3. On Saturday, October 5, 2024, around 12:40 AM, an SFPD Officer was traveling on Griffith Street towards San Fernando Mission Boulevard when his vehicle was struck by another

vehicle traveling southbound on San Fernando Mission Boulevard. SFPD officers and LAFD responded to the scene. Officers made contact with the driver of the other vehicle and detected a strong odor of alcohol on his breath. They also observed that the driver exhibited slurred speech and watery eyes. After conducting field sobriety tests, officers arrested the subject for felony DUI. The California Highway Patrol (CHP) also responded to assist with the traffic collision investigation. The patrol vehicle appears to be a total loss, and the officer sustained minor injuries, receiving treatment at the hospital.

4. On Saturday, October 5, 2024, at about 8:05 PM, SFPD Officers responded to a report of a traffic collision involving three parked vehicles in the intersection of Eighth Street and Orange Grove Avenue. The subject exhibited signs of alcohol impairment and was detained by officers. Breathalyzer tests indicated a BAC over .08 percent. The subject was subsequently arrested for DUI and driving without a license.
5. On Sunday, October 6, 2024, at approximately 3:47 AM, SFPD Officers responded to a report of a battery in progress in the 500 Block of Wolfskill Street. Following an investigation, a male subject was arrested for corporal injury to a spouse.
6. On Tuesday, October 8, 2024, around 11:30 AM, SFPD Officers responded to a report of suspicious circumstances in the 1800 Block of First Street. They made contact with a female subject and conducted an investigation. The subject was subsequently arrested for two outstanding warrants and possession of a controlled substance.
7. On Thursday, October 10, 2024, at approximately 6:50 AM, SFPD officers stopped a male subject for illegally riding his bicycle on the sidewalk in the 1300 block of San Fernando Road. During the stop, the subject was arrested for possession of methamphetamine, possession of drug paraphernalia, carrying a concealed dirk or dagger, and an outstanding warrant.
8. On Friday, October 11, 2024 at about 8:50 AM, SFPD officers responded to a report of a traffic collision at Las Palmas Park. A male subject involved in the incident was arrested for DUI.
9. On Saturday, October 12, 2024, around 5:05 PM, SFPD officers responded to a report of a male subject swinging an unknown object at another person in the 1400 Block of San Fernando Road. The subject was later arrested for assault with a deadly weapon.
10. On Tuesday, October 15, 2024, at approximately 1:00 AM, SFPD officers on uniformed patrol observed a vehicle driving without headlights. They conducted a traffic stop near the intersection of Truman Street and South Workman Street for driving without lights and exhibition of speed. A license check of the driver revealed they had a suspended or revoked license and an outstanding DUI warrant. Further investigation found the driver in possession

of controlled substances. The driver was arrested for possession of methamphetamine and illicit drugs, and the vehicle was impounded.

11. On Tuesday, October 15, 2024, at approximately 8:20 PM, SFPD officers responded to a report of a large crowd in the 400 Block of San Fernando Mission Boulevard near Warehouse Shoe Sale. Officers dispersed the crowd and successfully prevented a possible flash mob retail theft attempt.
12. On Wednesday, October 16, 2024, around 12:00 AM, SFPD officers observed a vehicle with an illegal license plate cover make a turn without using a signal near Hagar Street and De Garmo Street. They conducted a traffic stop and ran a want and warrant check, which revealed that the passenger was on active Post-Release Community Supervision (PRCS). During the investigation, officers found drug paraphernalia. The driver was arrested for possession of drug paraphernalia, and the passenger was arrested due to a pending open felony case.
13. On Wednesday, October 16, 2024, at approximately 9:55 AM, a SFPD officer received a Flock notification about a stolen vehicle. The officer located the vehicle near Fifth Street and Griswold Avenue and detained a male suspect, who was subsequently arrested for grand theft auto.
14. On Saturday, October 19, 2024, at approximately 12:37 AM, a SFPD officer conducted a traffic stop of a vehicle that nearly collided with his patrol vehicle. The stop occurred near North Maclay Avenue and Library Street. The officer made contact with the driver, who appeared to be under the influence of alcohol. After administering field sobriety tests, the officer arrested the driver for driving under the influence of alcohol. Breath samples taken at the SFPD Jail indicated a blood alcohol content over .08 percent.
15. On Sunday, October 20, 2024, at approximately 1:11 AM, a SFPD officer conducted a traffic stop near the intersection of San Fernando Road and Del Sur Street. Upon making contact with the driver, the officer detected a strong odor of alcohol on the driver's breath and observed that the driver had watery, bloodshot eyes. The officer conducted field sobriety tests and subsequently arrested the driver for driving under the influence.
16. On Sunday, October 20, 2024, around 8:00 PM, SFPD officers responded to a report of a male subject striking a vehicle with a sledgehammer in the 2000 block of Glenoaks Boulevard. During the investigation, officers discovered that the subject had also exhibited violent behavior towards his two dogs. The subject was arrested for animal cruelty, vandalism, providing false identification, and an outstanding warrant.

17. On Monday, October 21, 2024, at approximately 9:15 PM, a SFPD officer contacted two individuals on bicycles without lights near Hubbard Street and First Street. Following an investigation, a female subject was arrested for an outstanding warrant, while a male subject was arrested for possession of methamphetamine.
18. On Monday, October 21, 2024, at approximately 11:30 PM, SFPD officers received a Flock notification about a stolen vehicle traveling through San Fernando. Officers located the vehicle in the 700 block of South Workman Street. The vehicle attempted to evade officers by speeding through the shopping plaza parking lot. The vehicle exited the parking lot and tried to turn onto Lashburn Street but struck the front brick wall of a residence in the 11600 block of Rincon Street. Two passengers fled from the rear of the vehicle. The driver and front passenger, both juveniles, were detained and subsequently arrested. The front passenger was released from custody and transported to the hospital by LAFD. The driver was taken into custody and also transported to the hospital, then released to his parents with a citation and a juvenile court date.
