Subject: February 2025 Notable Police Department Events and Activities

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Transportation and Public Safety (TPS) Commission receive and file this informational report.

BACKGROUND:

Each month at the City of San Fernando Transportation and Public Safety Commission meeting, the Police Department submits and provides the governing board a brief overview of the previous month's community engagement activities, noteworthy incidents, and proactive enforcement.

ANALYSIS:

The San Fernando Police Department (SFPD) has recently heightened and further integrated its community profile in three major areas: Community Engagement, Proactive Enforcement and Quality of Life Enhancements.

For the month of January 2025, the SFPD has the following activities and incidents to report:

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT:

1. Special Parking Enforcement Detail

On Saturday, February 8, 2025, an SFPD Community Service Officer (CSO) conducted an eight-hour Parking Enforcement Detail as part of the City Council's overtime-budgetary enhancement. Parking Enforcement Operations targeted the Mall District, Maclay Corridor, shopping centers, and residential streets to improve accessibility, traffic flow, and compliance with city regulations. The detail addressed illegal parking, abandoned vehicles, and parking violations, issuing 39 tickets in total.

February 2025 Notable Police Department Activities

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2. K9 Demonstration

On Monday, February 10, 2025, SFPD K9 Officer Murillo and K9 Renz provided a second K9 demonstration for students at Morningside Elementary.

3. San Fernando Coalition to Prevent Gang Violence

The San Fernando Community Coalition to Prevent Gang Violence met on Thursday, February 13, 2025, at 1:30 PM at Recreation Park (208 Park Avenue). The meeting focused on collaborative strategies to address gang violence in the San Fernando area.

4. Community Academy

The Community Academy meeting was held on Wednesday, February 19, 2025, at 5:30 PM at San Fernando Middle School, located at 130 North Brand Boulevard. Chief Fabian Valdez responded to community concerns about immigration and discussed the topic of "Guiding with Care: Child Discipline and Building Healthy Boundaries."

5. Neighborhood Watch Meeting

The Neighborhood Watch Meeting was held on February 19, 2025, at 6:00 PM in the City Council Chambers. SFPD personnel reviewed Part 1 Crime Statistics and addressed participants' questions and concerns.

6. Business Watch Meeting

The Business Watch Meeting was held on February 26, 2025, at 12:00 PM in the City Council Chambers. SFPD personnel reviewed Part 1 Crime Statistics and responded to participants' questions and concerns.

7. Coffee Time with the Chief

On Monday, March 3, 2025, from 10 AM to 12 PM, Chief Valdez will address residents' questions and concerns at "Coffee Time with the Chief of Police" at the San Fernando Child and Family Center, located at 919 1st Street, San Fernando.

NOTEWORTHY EVENTS:

1. On Monday, February 3, 2025, around 1:40 AM, SFPD officers conducted a traffic stop in the area of Hubbard Avenue and Truman Street. They subsequently arrested a male subject for possession of methamphetamine and a sexual assault warrant.
2. On Wednesday, February 5, 2025, at approximately 12:20 PM, SFPD officers responded to a student walkout in the 1000 Block of Arroyo Ave. Command staff and detectives assisted in monitoring the crowd and ensuring safe passage to San Fernando City Hall and back to Cesar Chavez Learning Academy. Additional patrols and Area C officers were called to help with crowd control.

February 2025 Notable Police Department Activities

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3. On Wednesday, February 5, 2025, at about 5:40 PM, SFPD officers responded to a report of a family disturbance in the 600 Block of Workman Street. They arrested a male subject for battery.
4. On Friday, February 7, 2025, starting at around 8:00 AM, SFPD and Public Works personnel responded to a planned protest/school walkout at Cesar Chavez Learning Academy. SFPD officers escorted various student groups throughout the City and continued escorting them until they entered Los Angeles City limits.
5. On Friday, February 7, 2025, around 4:00 PM, an SFPD officer responded to a Flock camera alert of a stolen vehicle, locating it near Park Ave and Library St. Additional officers assisted, and a male suspect was arrested for failing to return a rented vehicle and a having a misdemeanor warrant issued.
6. On Saturday, February 8, 2025, at approximately 5:15 PM, SFPD officers responded to a report of a possible shoplifter at Home Depot. Officers detained the subject and, following an investigation, arrested the subject for an outstanding warrant from the Pasadena Police Department.
7. On Saturday, February 8, 2025, at about 11:45 PM, an SFPD officer responded to a Flock notification of a stolen vehicle traveling in the area of North Maclay Avenue and Glenoaks Boulevard. The officer located the vehicle in the 900 Block of Macneil Street, contacted the driver, and arrested him for receiving stolen property.
8. On Sunday, February 9, 2025, around 10:30 PM, an SFPD officer responded to a family dispute in the 600 Block of North Workman Avenue. Following an investigation, the officer arrested an adult male for assault and battery.
9. On Tuesday, February 11, 2025, at approximately 2:00 AM, SFPD officers conducted a traffic enforcement stop of a vehicle in the area of Fifth Street and Hagar Street. Two occupants of the vehicle were arrested for possession of narcotics and the driver was also cited for driving without a license.
10. On Wednesday, February 12, 2025, around 8:30 AM, SFPD officers conducted a traffic enforcement stop in the area of South Maclay Avenue and Pico Street. They arrested a male subject for two outstanding LAPD warrants.

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11. On Wednesday, February 12, 2025, at about 12:35 PM, an SFPD officer responded to an electronic report of a suspected child abuse in the 1200 Block of Glenoaks Boulevard. Following an investigation, he arrested a female subject for child endangerment.
12. On Friday, February 14, 2025, at approximately 11:00 PM, an SFPD officer conducted a traffic enforcement stop in the area of San Fernando Road and Hubbard Avenue. The driver was subsequently arrested for driving without a license, possession of methamphetamine, possession of drug paraphernalia, identity theft, and credit card theft. The vehicle's passenger was arrested for an outstanding warrant.
13. On Tuesday, February 18, 2025 around 4:00 AM, while on patrol, an SFPD officer observed black smoke coming from a structure in the 900 block of Maclay Avenue. The officer contacted LAFD and coordinated traffic units. LAFD arrived on scene and handled the incident to conclusion.
14. On Thursday, February 20, 2025, at about 1:15 AM, SFPD officers responded to a report of a possible violation of a restraining order in the 200 Block of Fermoore Street. Officers contacted and detained the subject and, following an investigation, arrested the subject for an outstanding warrant.
15. On Thursday, February 20, 2025, at approximately 9:50 AM, an SFPD officer observed a driver talking on her cell phone while driving and conducted a traffic enforcement stop in the area of South Maclay Avenue and Truman Street. Following an investigation, the officer issued the driver a citation for driving with a suspended driver's license and using a cell phone while driving.
16. On Saturday, February 22, 2025, at about 10:00 PM, an SFPD officer initiated a traffic enforcement stop, but the vehicle failed to yield and pulled into a driveway in the 1200 Block of Kewen Street. The driver was subsequently arrested for driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs and resisting arrest.
17. On Sunday, February 23, 2025, at approximately 1:15 AM, an SFPD officer responded to a report of a domestic disturbance in the 700 Block of Lashburn Street. Following an investigation, a male subject was arrested for domestic violence and contempt of court.
18. On Monday, February 24, 2025, around 1:00 AM, an SFPD officer responded to a Flock notification of a stolen vehicle in the area of North Brand Boulevard. The officer initiated a traffic stop in the 200 Block of Park Avenue. The driver was arrested for grand theft auto and driving without a license.
19. On Monday, February 24, 2025, at about 7:50 AM, an SFPD officer conducted a traffic stop of a subject on a motorcycle who had conducted a traffic stop in the area of Chatsworth Drive

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and Woodworth Street. Following an investigation, the officer arrested the subject for possession of loaded firearm near a school zone and impersonating a police officer.

20. On Tuesday, February 25, 2025, at approximately 10:40 PM, an SFPD officer received a Flock notification of a stolen vehicle entering the city near Fifth Street and Arroyo Avenue. The officer located the vehicle and followed it while waiting for backup. A traffic stop was initiated and the driver failed to yield, leading to a pursuit. The suspect struck a parked car while turning southbound onto Polk Street from Glenoaks Boulevard and eventually crashed into a business’s metal fence. The suspect exited the vehicle, jumped over the fence, and fled onto the business property. Officers set up a perimeter, and with assistance from LAPD Air Support, Burbank Police’s drone operator, and the SFPD K9 Unit, the suspect was arrested for reckless evading, driving on the wrong side of the road, grand theft auto, felon in possession of ammunition, misdemeanor hit-and-run, providing false identification to a police officer, driving without a license, and resisting arrest.

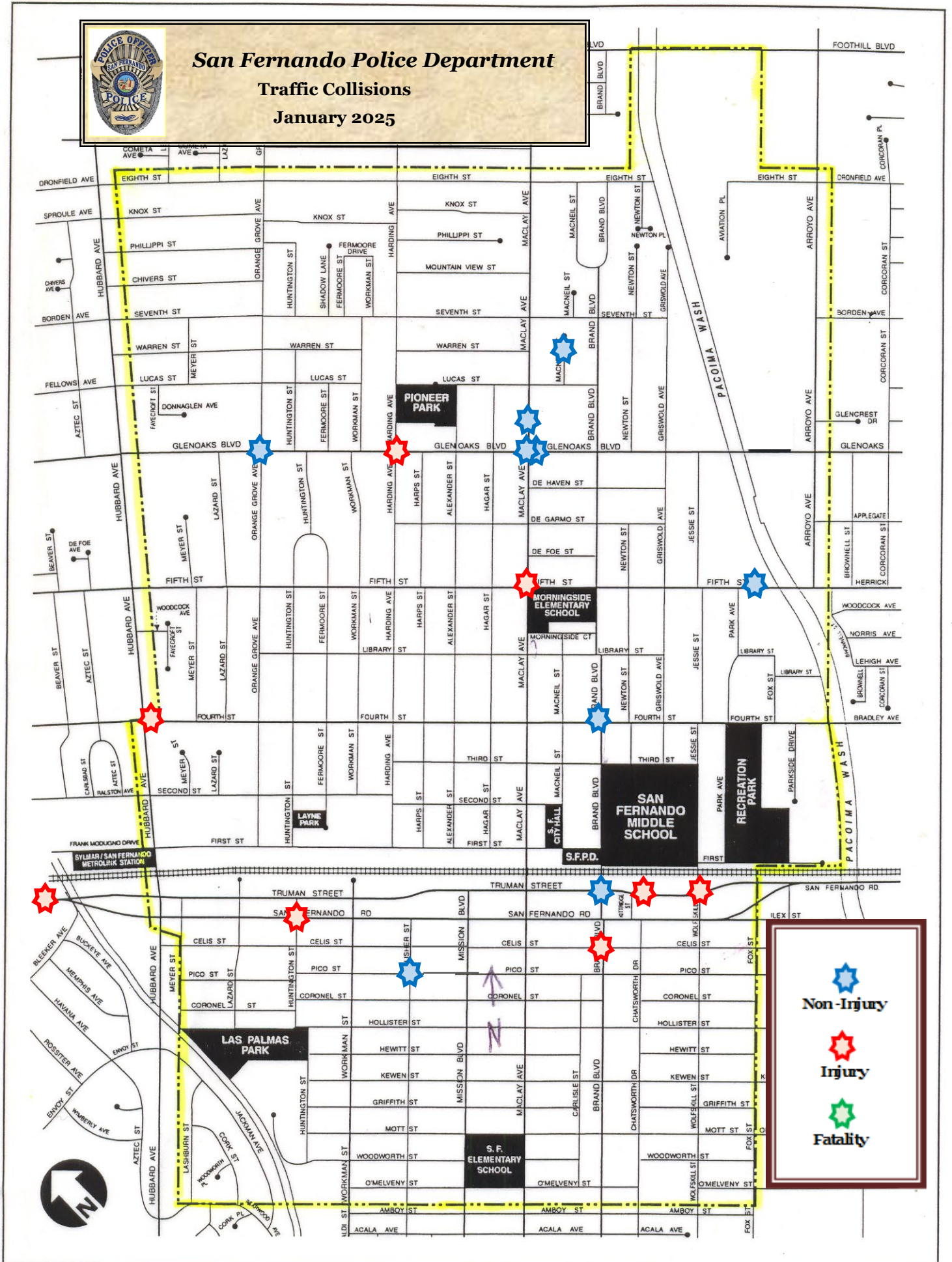
