RECOMMENDATION:

BACKGROUND:

Each month at the City of San Fernando Transportation and Public Safety Commission meeting, the Police Department submits and provides the governing board a brief overview of the previous month's community engagement activities, noteworthy incidents, and proactive enforcement.

ANALYSIS:

The San Fernando Police Department (SFPD) has recently heightened and further integrated its community profile in three major areas: Community Engagement, Proactive Enforcement and Quality of Life Enhancements.

For the month of March 2025, the SFPD has the following activities and incidents to report:

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT:

1. Coffee Time with the Chief

On Monday, March 3, 2025, from 10 AM to 12 PM, Chief Valdez met with community members and Department of Mental Health employees at the San Fernando Child and Family Center (919 1st Street, San Fernando) for "Coffee Time with the Chief of Police." Chief Valdez provided updates on police department projects, including the integration of mental health clinicians into department operations through a grant from the Federal Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA).

March 2025 Notable Police Department Activities

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2. San Fernando Community Coalition to Prevent Gang Violence.

Acting Sergeant Jorge Cervantes and Chief Fabian Valdez attended the San Fernando Community Coalition to Prevent Gang Violence on Thursday, March 6, 2025. On March 13, 2025, the Coalition met at Recreation Park.

3. Community Academy

The Community Academy met on Wednesday, March 19, 2025, at 5:30 PM at San Fernando Middle School, 130 North Brand Boulevard. Hope the Mission representatives introduced the Mental Health Clinician Program, and K9 Officer Murillo, along with K9 Renz, provided a K9 demonstration.

4. Neighborhood Watch Meeting

The Neighborhood Watch meeting was held on Wednesday, March 19, 2025 at 6:00 PM in the San Fernando City Council Chambers. Chief Valdez discussed current police department projects, SB 54, and "Daylighting" laws.

5. Business Watch Meeting.

The Business Watch meeting was held on Wednesday, March 26, 2025 at noon in the San Fernando City Council Chambers.

NOTEWORTHY EVENTS:

- On Sunday, March 2, 2025, around 10:45 PM, an SFPD officer conducted a traffic stop on a
 vehicle without license plates near Laurel Canyon Boulevard and Hubbard Street. During the
 investigation, the officer discovered a cut-off catalytic converter and an LCD screen in the
 car's trunk. The driver was arrested for driving with an expired license, possession of stolen
 property, and a parole violation.
- On Wednesday, March 4, 2025, around midnight, an SFPD officer stopped a vehicle with a
 broken taillight near Foothill Boulevard and Maclay Avenue. The driver told the officer her
 license was suspended for DUI. Further investigation revealed she had an outstanding
 warrant. The person who came to pick up the vehicle also had an outstanding warrant. Both
 were arrested.
- 3. On Saturday, March 8, 2025, at about 1:45 AM, an SFPD officer conducted a traffic stop near Hubbard Avenue and Glenoaks Boulevard. The officer arrested the driver for driving under the influence of alcohol and driving with a blood alcohol content of .08 percent or higher.
- 4. On Saturday, March 8, 2025, at approximately 9:30 PM, SFPD officers received notification from the Los Angeles Police Department (Foothill Division) that they had located a vehicle stolen earlier that day during a residential burglary in the 1000 Block of Fourth Street and had

the suspect in custody. Officers responded and arrested the suspect for burglary, grand theft auto, and possession of drug paraphernalia.

- 5. On Monday, March 10, 2025, around 12:10 PM, SFPD received a Flock notification of a stolen vehicle near Hubbard Avenue and Fourth Street. Officers located the vehicle near North Brand Boulevard and Fourth Street. As they approached, the driver parked and exited the vehicle. Officers detained the driver and, after a warrant check, arrested him for joyriding, possession of methamphetamine, and a felony warrant for grand theft auto.
- 6. On Tuesday, March 11, 2025, at approximately 6:05 AM, an SFPD officer responded to a report of a domestic dispute in the 2000 block of Second Street. The victim reported that her ex-boyfriend had kicked the side mirror off her vehicle during the argument. Following an investigation, the officer arrested a male subject for felony vandalism.
- 7. On Wednesday, March 12, 2025, at approximately 8:40 AM, SFPD officers conducted a traffic stop for expired registration near Truman Street and Kittridge Avenue. The driver was arrested for an outstanding warrant and cited for driving without a valid license.
- 8. On Wednesday, March 12, 2025, around 8:20 PM, an SFPD officer conducted a traffic stop near San Fernando Road and Hubbard Avenue for a non-operational brake light and expired registration. Following an investigation, the driver was arrested for possession of methamphetamine, drug paraphernalia, driving without a valid license, and outstanding warrants.
- 9. On Wednesday, March 12, 2025, at about 11:30 PM, an SFPD officer conducted a traffic stop near South Brand Boulevard and Mott Street. An investigation revealed the passenger had approximately 43g of methamphetamine, two outstanding warrants, and was subject to a restraining order with the driver as the protected person. The passenger was arrested for possession and transportation of methamphetamine for sale, contempt of court, and the outstanding warrants.
- 10. On Thursday, March 13, 2025, at approximately 1:10 PM, SFPD officers responded to a report of a theft in the 1000 Block of First Street. A female subject, who had entered the property and stolen a generator, was arrested for petty theft.
- 11. On Friday, March 14, 2025, around 11:50 AM, SFPD officers responded to a shoplifting report in the 12900 Block of Foothill Boulevard (The Home Depot). They arrested a male subject for shoplifting, resisting arrest, and two outstanding warrants.
- 12. On Monday, March 17, 2025, at about 8:00 AM, an SFPD officer conducted a traffic stop of a vehicle with an expired registration in the area of Fourth Street and North Maclay Avenue. During his investigation, the officer learned the driver had a suspended license and an

outstanding warrant. The officer arrested the driver for the outstanding warrant and issued him a citation for driving with a suspended license.

- 13. On Monday, March 17, 2025, at approximately 1:00 PM, SFPD officers responded to a call from LAPD that they had detained two male adults for assault with a deadly weapon in the area of Hubbard Avenue and Frank Modugno Drive. One subject was arrested for assault with a deadly weapon, throwing an object at a vehicle with the intent to do bodily harm, and narcotics offenses. The second subject was arrested for possession of methamphetamine.
- 14. On Monday, March 17, 2025, around 1:40 PM, an SFPD officer responded to a report of a male subject unconscious in a vehicle parked in the 1000 Block of Celis Street. The investigation revealed the subject had an outstanding warrant and was in possession of cocaine. He was arrested for possession of a controlled substance and the outstanding warrant.
- 15. On Tuesday, March 18, 2025, at 2:30 PM, Los Angeles County District Attorney Nathan Hochman spoke to police personnel about his criminal justice philosophies and answered questions.
- 16. On Tuesday, March 18, 2025, at around 8:00 PM, SFPD officers responded to a robbery in progress at The Home Depot located in the 12900 Block of Foothill Boulevard. The suspect, confronted by Loss Prevention for shoplifting, pushed an employee, then fled in a vehicle. When located by officers, he barricaded himself inside the vehicle. After being safely removed from the vehicle, the suspect was arrested for robbery and resisting arrest. A search of the vehicle uncovered 10 empty cans of compressed keyboard cleaner, likely used during the incident.
- 17. On Wednesday, March 19, 2025, at approximately 8:30 AM, SFPD officers responded to a report of a reckless driver in the 600 Block of South Workman Street. The reporting party stated that the driver nearly collided with her, and she was following the vehicle. Shortly after, at 8:35 AM, SFPD received a report of a vehicle vs. motorcycle felony hit and run in the area of Pico Street and San Fernando Mission Boulevard. Officers located the motorcyclist, who was treated on scene for minor injuries by LAFD, but were unable to locate the hit and run suspect. Officers determined the reckless driver had run a red light, causing the collision with the motorcyclist. An investigation is ongoing.
- 18. On Wednesday, March 19, 2025, at about 11:50 PM, an SFPD officer conducted a traffic stop in the area of Hubbard Street and Laurel Canyon. He arrested a female subject for outstanding warrants, possession of methamphetamine, and identity theft.

- 19. On Thursday, March 20, 2025, around 12:35 PM, SFPD officers were dispatched to a report of a domestic dispute in the 100 Block of Alexander Street. Following an investigation, they arrested a male subject for a violation of a restraining order.
- 20. On Thursday, March 20, 2025, at approximately 10:05 PM, SFPD officers conducted traffic stop of a speeding vehicle in the area of South Brand Boulevard at Mott Street. During their investigation, officers discovered a loaded assault rifle without a serial number in the back seat of the vehicle. The driver was subsequently arrested for driving without a license, possession of an assault weapon, carrying a concealed weapon, possession or sale of a firearm with altered or removed identification marks, and illegal possession or sale of a short-barreled rifle or sawed-off shotgun.
- 21. On Friday, March 21, 2025, at approximately 10:00 AM, an SFPD officer observed a vehicle driving recklessly near Fourth Street and North Brand Boulevard. The officer initiated a traffic stop at Fourth Street and Alexander Street and arrested the driver for reckless driving.
- 22. On Saturday, March 22, 2025, at about 10:40 PM, SFPD officers received a Flock notification about a vehicle linked to an extradition warrant from Denver, Colorado, for furnishing, manufacturing, or selling fentanyl resulting in death. Officers located the vehicle parked in the 1100 block of San Fernando Road, conducted surveillance, and arrested the driver for the outstanding warrant.
- 23. On Sunday, March 23, 2025, at approximately 10:25 PM, SFPD officers received a Flock notification of a stolen vehicle entering the City from Hubbard Avenue and San Fernando Road. Officers found the vehicle near San Fernando Road and San Fernando Mission Boulevard, where the driver had parked. After conducting a traffic stop and investigation, officers arrested the driver for driving or taking a vehicle without consent.
- 24. On Monday, March 24, 2025, around 8:30 AM, an SFPD officer contacted a male subject in Las Palmas Park and discovered he had outstanding warrants for vandalism and narcotics. The subject was arrested for the warrants.
- 25. On Monday, March 24, 2025, at approximately 10:35 PM, SFPD officers responded to a report of individuals carrying a handgun inside of a backpack in the area of Truman Street and Maclay Avenue. Officers contacted the subjects and determined that the handgun was an airsoft gun. Following an investigation, officers arrested a male subject for an outstanding warrant.
- 26. On Tuesday, March 25, 2025, at around 2:45 AM, an SFPD officer conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle with an expired registration sticker. During the investigation, the officer discovered the driver had an expired license and an outstanding DUI warrant. The driver was arrested for driving with an expired license and the outstanding warrant.
