### **BACKGROUND:**

Each month at the City of San Fernando Transportation and Public Safety Commission meeting, the Police Department submits and provides the governing board a brief overview of the previous month's community engagement activities, noteworthy incidents, and proactive enforcement.

### **ANALYSIS:**

The San Fernando Police Department (SFPD) has recently heightened and further integrated its community profile in three major areas: Community Engagement, Proactive Enforcement and Quality of Life Enhancements.

For the month of May 2025, the SFPD has the following activities and incidents to report:

### **COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT:**

#### **1. Law Enforcement United (LEU) Long Ride**

On Monday, May 5, 2025, Bicyclists from LEU's Long Ride stopped at the San Fernando Police Station to lay a wreath in memory of fallen officers and take photos with SFPD officers and other City staff members.

#### **2. ABC Minor Decoy Operation**

On Thursday, May 15, 2025, SFPD Detectives and California Department of Alcoholic Beverage control conducted a Minor Decoy Operation at various alcohol sales locations throughout the City.

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**3. Hope the Mission Outreach.**

Hope the Mission representatives participated in the Senior Fest at Las Palmas Park on Friday, May 16, 2025.

**4. SFPD K9 Demonstration**

On Tuesday, May 20, 2025, SFPD K9 Officer Murillo and K9 Renz provided a K9 demonstration at Foothill Learning Center.

**5. Neighborhood Watch Meeting**

The monthly Neighborhood Watch meeting was held on Wednesday, May 21, 2025. Detective Jorge Cervantes provided an update on Part 1 Crime Statistics and responded to questions and concerns of meeting participants.

**6. Business Watch Meeting**

The monthly Business Watch Meeting was held on Wednesday, May 28, 2025. Detective Cervantes provided an update on Part 1 Crime Statistics and responded to questions and concerns of meeting participants.

**7. Parent Academy**

On Wednesday, June 4, 2025, from 5:30 to 7:30 PM, the San Fernando Police Department and San Fernando Middle School will host a culmination ceremony for participants of the Spring Community Academy program. This program was created to support parents and community members by providing information about city government, offering parenting resources, and giving attendees the opportunity to engage directly with school and community leaders to have their questions answered.

### **NOTEWORTHY EVENTS:**

1. On Thursday, May 1, 2025, around 9:55 PM, SFPD officers observed a vehicle without registration tags parked at the intersection of Fourth Street and Macneil Street. They contacted the occupants of the vehicle and learned that the driver was on probation. During their investigation, they found a handgun concealed behind the passenger seat. They arrested the driver for possession of a concealed weapon, possession of an undetectable firearm, and possession of methamphetamine.
2. On Thursday, May 1, 2025, at about 2:00 PM, an SFPD officer responded to a report of suspected child abuse in the 100 Block of Harps Street. After contacting the suspect and the victim, she arrested a female suspect for child endangerment.
3. On Thursday, May 1, 2025, around 3:00 PM, SFPD officers responded to a report of a subject sleeping behind the wheel of her vehicle in the 600 Block of North Brand Boulevard. The

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vehicle was in drive, and the driver showed signs of intoxication. She was arrested for DUI and driving with a suspended license.

4. On Thursday, May 1, 2025, at approximately 10:50 PM, an SFPD officer observed a driver commit several traffic violations in the area of Hubbard Avenue and Pearwood Street. The driver was arrested for two outstanding warrants.
5. On Friday, May 2, 2025, at about 2:25 PM, an SFPD officer responded to a report of a male driver following a female in the 1000 Block of First Street. After locating and stopping the vehicle, the officer arrested the driver for DUI.
6. On Saturday, May 3, 2025, at approximately 12:00 PM, SFPD officers responded to a report of a shoplifting subject in the 700 Block of Workman Street. Upon arrival, officers arrested the subject for shoplifting and possession of methamphetamine.
7. On Saturday, May 3, 2025, around 8:30 PM, SFPD officers responded to a shoplifting suspect detained by Target Loss Prevention in the 12900 Block of Foothill Boulevard. The male suspect was arrested for shoplifting, petty theft with priors, and an outstanding warrant.
8. On Monday, May 5, 2025, at about 11:20 AM, SFPD officers received an ALPR alert of a stolen trailer being hauled by a Tesla near Truman and Wolfskill Streets. After a brief pursuit, the suspect crashed and fled on foot but was quickly apprehended. The convicted felon was arrested for multiple felony charges including possession of an unregistered firearm, stolen property, narcotics, and felony evading.
9. On Monday, May 5, 2025 at approximately 9:40 PM, SFPD officers received a Flock notification of a stolen vehicle in the area of Truman Street and Hubbard Avenue. Officers initiated a traffic stop at San Fernando Mission Boulevard and the 5 Freeway. They arrested the driver for grand theft auto and an outstanding warrant.
10. On Tuesday, May 6, 2025, around 1:00 AM, while patrolling in the area of Truman Street and Huntington Street, an SFPD officer stopped a vehicle with a broken tail light. The driver, who had a fake registration tag, multiple types of ammunition, and a shotgun, was arrested for being a felon in possession of a firearm and registration misuse.
11. On Tuesday, May 6, 2025, at about 8:10 AM, an SFPD officer responded to a report of a subject brandishing a knife in the 600 Block of Workman Street. He arrested the subject for brandishing a weapon and loitering at school or place children congregate.
12. On Wednesday, May 7, 2025, at approximately 10:25 PM, SFPD officers responded to a report of a fight at the intersection of South Maclay Avenue and Hollister Street. A victim reported

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being assaulted with water and a glass bottle by an unknown male. The suspect was located nearby and arrested for assault with a deadly weapon and resisting arrest.

13. On Thursday, May 8, 2025, around 9:20 PM, an SFPD officer responded to the Home Depot regarding a detained shoplifting suspect. The investigation revealed the suspect had stolen \$200 worth of merchandise. The suspect was arrested for shoplifting.
14. On Friday, May 9, 2025, at approximately 8:00 AM, SFPD officers responded to a report of a subject throwing bottles into the street in the 700 Block of Kalisher Street. Following an investigation, they arrested the subject for possession of methamphetamine.
15. On Saturday, May 10, 2025, at about 12:40 AM, an SFPD officer was flagged down by a victim of a hit and run in the 100 Block of North Hubbard Avenue. The suspect vehicle was located on Bradley Avenue, and the driver, who showed signs of intoxication, was arrested for DUI.
16. On Saturday, May 10, 2025, at approximately 11:25 AM, an SFPD officer observed a vehicle double parked in the 500 Block of Hagar Street. The officer conducted a traffic enforcement stop of the vehicle in the area of Fifth Street and Alexander Street. The driver was issued a citation for the parking violation and a passenger was arrested for outstanding warrants.
17. On Sunday, May 11, 2025, at about 7:15 PM, SFPD officers responded to a Flock notification of a stolen vehicle in the area of Hubbard Street and Truman Street. They located the vehicle at a car wash in the 1700 Block of San Fernando Road. The suspect attempted to flee but was apprehended and arrested for multiple offenses including grand theft auto, possession of a controlled substance while armed, and resisting arrest.

During the traffic stop, they observed a nitrous oxide tank and other paraphernalia. Following an investigation, they arrested the driver for possession of nitrous oxide and a controlled substance.

26. On Tuesday, May 20, 2025, around 7:45 PM, an SFPD officer observed a hand-to-hand drug transaction in the area of Gladstone Street and Arroyo Boulevard. He conducted a traffic enforcement stop of the vehicle and learned that the driver was on probation for narcotic violations. The officer observed a baggie of fentanyl in the console of the vehicle and arrested the driver for possession of narcotics.
27. On Tuesday, May 20, 2025, at approximately 9:40 AM, an SFPD officer responded to a Flock notification of a stolen vehicle in the 900 Block of Truman Street. The officer located the vehicle and conducted a traffic enforcement stop. Following an investigation, he arrested the driver for joyriding, driving without a license, and possession of a controlled substance.

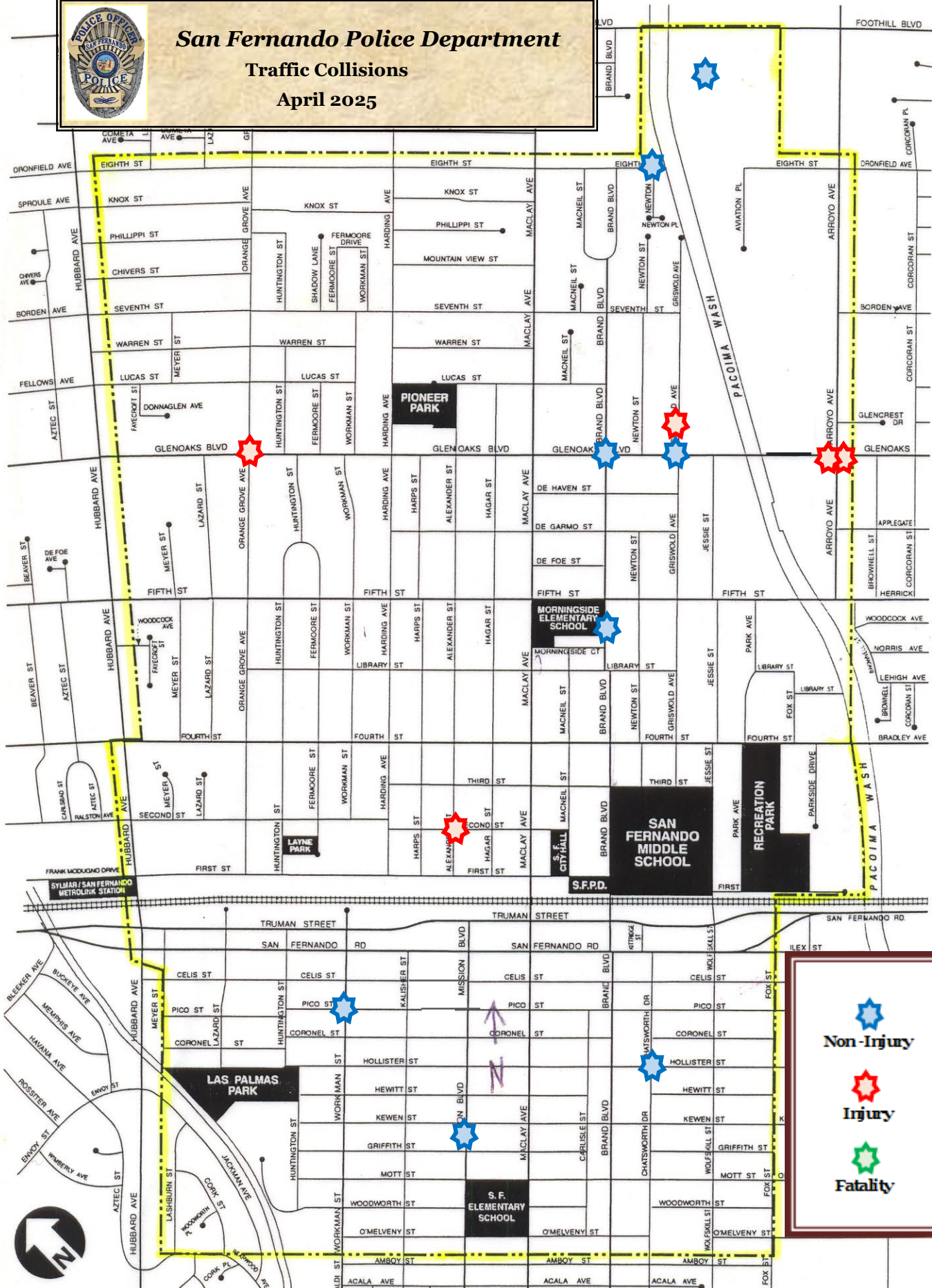
