SAN FERNANDO POLICE ARREST VANDAL SUSPECTED IN MONTHS-LONG CRIME SPREE

SAN FERNANDO, CA – Police Officers and Detectives from the San Fernando Police Department (SFPD) have arrested a 29-year-old male adult in connection with a series of felony vandalism cases that have plagued the city for several months.



The suspect, identified as Chris Ramirez Vasquez, was taken into custody following a quick response by Officers after he was seen today vandalizing property at a local church. An alert eyewitness immediately contacted the SFPD, prompting a rapid response from patrol units.

Officers observed Ramirez Vasquez fleeing the scene of the vandalism into a nearby apartment complex where he is known to reside.

Officers quickly surrounded the location and eventually made entry into the apartment, locating Ramirez Vasquez, who was hiding inside. He was arrested without further incident.

Ramirez Vasquez is accused of causing between \$3,000 and \$4,000 in damage to both public and private property across the City, repeatedly tagging the moniker “Blur.” In addition to felony vandalism, he was also wanted for making criminal threats in another incident.

“This arrest is the result of the swift response of our patrol officers and investigative work of our detectives,” said Police Chief Fabian Valdez. “It also
