CITY OF SAN FERNANDO TO CONDUCT A DUI SOBRIETY AND DRIVER'S LICENSE CHECKPOINT ON FRIDAY, MAY 23, 2025

San Fernando, CA - The San Fernando Police Department will conduct a DUI sobriety and driver's license checkpoint on Friday, May 23, 2025. The checkpoint will take place at an undisclosed location within city limits between the hours of 6:00 PM and 2:00 AM.

The purpose of the DUI checkpoint is to deter and prevent driver from operating a vehicle under the influence of alcohol, cannabis, or other drugs and to ensure all drivers are properly licensed. This initiative is part of the San Fernando Police Department's ongoing commitment to ensuring the safety of our community.

Message from Chief Valdez:

"Driving under the influence of alcohol or narcotics is extremely dangerous and puts everyone on the road at risk. We have seen firsthand the devastating impact that impaired driving can have on families and our community. We urge all drivers to make responsible choices—never drive under the influence. Designate a sober driver, use a rideshare service, or plan ahead to avoid putting lives in danger.

DUI saturation patrols have proven to be an effective deterrent, helping reduce the number of impaired drivers on the road. During these patrols, officers will be actively monitoring for signs of alcohol and drug impairment, as well as ensuring that drivers are in possession of a valid driver's license.
