STAFF COMMUNICATION

Director of Public Works Wendell Johnson highlighted the following:

- Traffic calming possibility (candle stick delineators) that can be used on streets that do not qualify for speed humps. Mr. Johnson will bring back information at a future meeting
- Encroachment permit that allows installation of 2-3 feet of each side of a driveway. Information on program will be brought back at a future meeting.
- Overnight parking restrictions in the downtown area.

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Manuel Fabian provided update on traffic study results for the 500 block of Harps and also provided locations of bus shelter being installed as part of the Bus Shelter Project.

Vice Chair Cuellar would like update on City cameras. Commander CJ Chiasson provided information on cameras. Vice Chair would like to agendize Update on Crossing Guards once schools start (i.e., number of crossing guards and locations). Commander CJ Chiasson provided information.

Subject: August 2025 Notable Police Department Events and Activities

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Transportation and Public Safety (TPS) Commission receive and file this informational report.

BACKGROUND:

Each month at the City of San Fernando Transportation and Public Safety Commission meeting, the Police Department submits and provides the governing board a brief overview of the previous month's community engagement activities, noteworthy incidents, and proactive enforcement.

ANALYSIS:

The San Fernando Police Department (SFPD) has recently heightened and further integrated its community profile in three major areas: Community Engagement, Proactive Enforcement and Quality of Life Enhancements.

For the month of August 2025, the SFPD has the following activities and incidents to report:

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT:

1. Neighborhood Watch Meeting

The monthly Neighborhood Watch meeting was held on Wednesday, August 20, 2025, at 6:00 PM in the City Council Chambers. Detective Jorge Cervantes reviewed crime statistics, addressed participants' concerns and responded to questions.

2. Business Watch Meeting

The monthly Business Watch meeting was held on Wednesday, August 27, 2025, at noon in the City Council Chambers. Detective Sergeant Pete Aguirre reviewed crime statistics, address participants' concerns and responded to questions.

August 2025 Notable Police Department Activities

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3. Park Safety Initiative

As part of the Safe and Beautiful Park Initiative, the Police Department will dedicate approximately 112 hours to undercover operations targeting smoking, gambling, drinking, and vandalism in City parks. Additionally, foot patrols and community engagement efforts will help build trust and ensure visible law enforcement presence to deter illegal activities.

NOTEWORTHY EVENTS:

1. On Friday, August 1, 2025 at about 9:50 PM, SFPD officers responded to a report of a male driver passed out in a vehicle in the Burger King drive-thru located in the 2000 block of Glenoaks Boulevard. While contacting the driver, officers detected the odor of alcohol. Following an investigation, the driver was arrested for DUI.
2. On Saturday, August 2, 2025, at about 3:35 PM, an SFPD officer responded to a report of a domestic violence incident in the 100 block of Harding Avenue. An adult female was arrested for domestic violence.
3. On Saturday, August 2, 2025, at approximately 9:10 PM, SFPD officers responded to a report of a domestic violence incident in the area of Hubbard Avenue and San Fernando Road. Following an investigation, officers arrested a male subject for domestic violence and violation of a restraining order.
4. On Tuesday, August 5, 2025, around 2:00 AM, an SFPD officer conducted a traffic stop in the area of San Fernando Road and the east city limits. The officer arrested a male subject for possession of a controlled substance and possession of nitrous oxide.
5. On Tuesday, August 5, 2025, at about 3:15 AM, SFPD officers responded to a report of a suspicious vehicle in the area of First Street and Park Avenue. The female occupant of the vehicle had a baggie of methamphetamine in plain sight. She was arrested for possession of methamphetamine and resisting arrest.
6. On Tuesday, August 5, 2025, at approximately 6:30 PM, SFPD officers responded to a report of someone calling for help from a structure in San Fernando Recreation Park. Officers located a female subject stuck in a chimney that was attached to the structure. LAFD responded and extracted her. She was arrested for possession of methamphetamine and trespassing.
7. On Wednesday, August 6, 2025, at approximately 10:00 PM, an SFPD officer conducted a traffic enforcement stop in the area of Truman Street and Huntington Street. The Department's K9 unit also responded to conduct a search for narcotics. Following an investigation, the subject was arrested for outstanding warrants and possession of narcotics.

August 2025 Notable Police Department Activities

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8. On Thursday, August 7, 2025, at about 6:40 AM, SFPD officers responded to a report of two people sleeping in a vehicle in the 1700 block of Truman Street. While contacting one of the subjects, they discovered he was in possession of methamphetamine and fentanyl. He was arrested for possession of a controlled substance, and his vehicle was impounded.
9. On Thursday, August 7, 2025, at about 6:00 PM, SFPD detectives conducted surveillance on a residence in the 31000 block of Quail Valley Road in Castaic to locate an attempted murder suspect from an earlier incident. Detectives saw the suspect leave the residence and arrested him for attempted murder.
10. On Friday, August 8, 2025, at approximately 10:10 AM, an SFPD officer responded to a shoplifting report at the CVS located in the 1200 block of San Fernando Road. Following an investigation, the officer arrested a female subject for shoplifting.
11. On Tuesday, August 12, 2025, at about 8:00 PM, SFPD officers responded to a report of battery in the 1200 block of Coronel Street. The suspect, who had struck the victim multiple times, attempted to flee on foot during the investigation. Officers detained the suspect and arrested him for elder abuse.
12. On Wednesday, August 13, 2025, around 8:15 AM, an SFPD officer conducted an extra patrol (CRM) at Rudy Ortega Park. While patrolling, he saw a male subject preparing to ingest Fentanyl. He arrested the subject for possession of a controlled substance.
13. On Wednesday, August 13, 2025, at approximately 1:30 PM, SFPD officers received a Flock ALPR alert of a stolen box truck near Truman Street and Wolfskill Street and located it near Truman Street and South Maclay Avenue. The driver jumped from the moving vehicle and fled on foot, causing the truck to collide with a stopped San Fernando Public Works vehicle. After a brief foot pursuit, officers arrested the suspect for grand theft auto, obstructing and delaying a peace officer, misdemeanor hit and run, and driving without a valid license.
14. On Thursday, August 14, 2025, at about 7:00 AM, SFPD officers responded to reports of a suspect firing a gun at a victim near Third Street and North Maclay Avenue. They located and detained a subject matching the description, who admitted to having an airsoft gun. At the conclusion of their investigation, officers arrested him for discharging a BB gun in a grossly negligent manner with intent to cause harm to the victim.
15. On Thursday, August 14, 2025, around 8:00 PM, SFPD officers received a Flock ALPR alert of a vehicle wanted for grand theft in the Home Depot parking lot. The vehicle was located near Arroyo Avenue and Eighth Street, where officers conducted an investigative traffic stop. The driver was arrested on felony warrants out of SFPD and Palmdale.

August 2025 Notable Police Department Activities

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16. On Thursday, August 14, 2025, at approximately 1:50 AM, SFPD officers responded to a Flock ALPR alert of a stolen vehicle near Fifth Street and North Meyer Avenue. The vehicle was located and stopped in the area of Herrick Avenue and Daventry Street. The driver was arrested for joyriding, driving with a suspended or revoked license, and possession of methamphetamine, while the passenger was arrested on outstanding warrants.
17. On Friday, August 15, 2025, around 6:20 PM, SFPD officers responded to a report of a male subject striking a vehicle with a metal pipe at a Tesla charging station located in the 1000 block of Celis Street. Following an investigation, an adult male was arrested for vandalism.
18. On Friday, August 15, 2025, at about 7:50 PM, an SFPD reserve officer was flagged down by bystanders about a fight in progress in the 900 block of Truman Street. Additional officers responded and arrested a male subject for robbery, possession of methamphetamine, and possession of drug paraphernalia.
19. On Friday, August 15, 2025, around 8:25 PM, SFPD officers responded to Target regarding a report of a known theft suspect inside the store. A female suspect who attempted to steal \$400 worth of merchandise was arrested for shoplifting.
20. On Saturday, August 16, 2025, at approximately 8:00 PM, SFPD officers responded to Target regarding a report of a male subject attempting to shoplift. When confronted, the subject returned the items and tried to flee but was detained and arrested for shoplifting.
21. On Monday, August 18, 2025, around 9:15 PM, while on patrol, SFPD officers investigated an occupied vehicle with drug paraphernalia in plain view. The occupant was found with 12 stolen identification cards and cited. A second subject who claimed ownership of the vehicle was arrested on an outstanding felony warrant.
22. On Friday, August 22, 2025, at about 10:00 PM, SFPD officers responded to a theft report at CVS in the 1200 block of San Fernando Road. They located the female suspect near San Fernando Road and Brand Boulevard and arrested her for shoplifting and an outstanding warrant from Beverly Hills.
23. On Saturday, August 23, 2025, at about 9:10 AM, SFPD officers patrolling Layne Park observed a male acting erratically near the restroom. After contacting him, they arrested the subject for possession of methamphetamine and drug paraphernalia.
24. On Sunday, August 24, 2025, at about 9:20 PM, SFPD officers responded to a report of a male lying in the intersection of Arroyo Avenue and Eighth Street after being struck by a vehicle. The subject was unresponsive and pronounced deceased by LAFD. On Monday, August 25, 2025, SFPD detectives arrested a male suspect for felony hit and run and manslaughter.

August 2025 Notable Police Department Activities

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25. On Monday, August 25, 2025, at about 7:20 PM, SFPD officers responded to a report of a subject causing a disturbance and vandalizing washing machines at Coin Laundry in the 1900 block of Glenoaks Boulevard. Officers located the suspect nearby and arrested him for felony vandalism and assault with a deadly weapon.

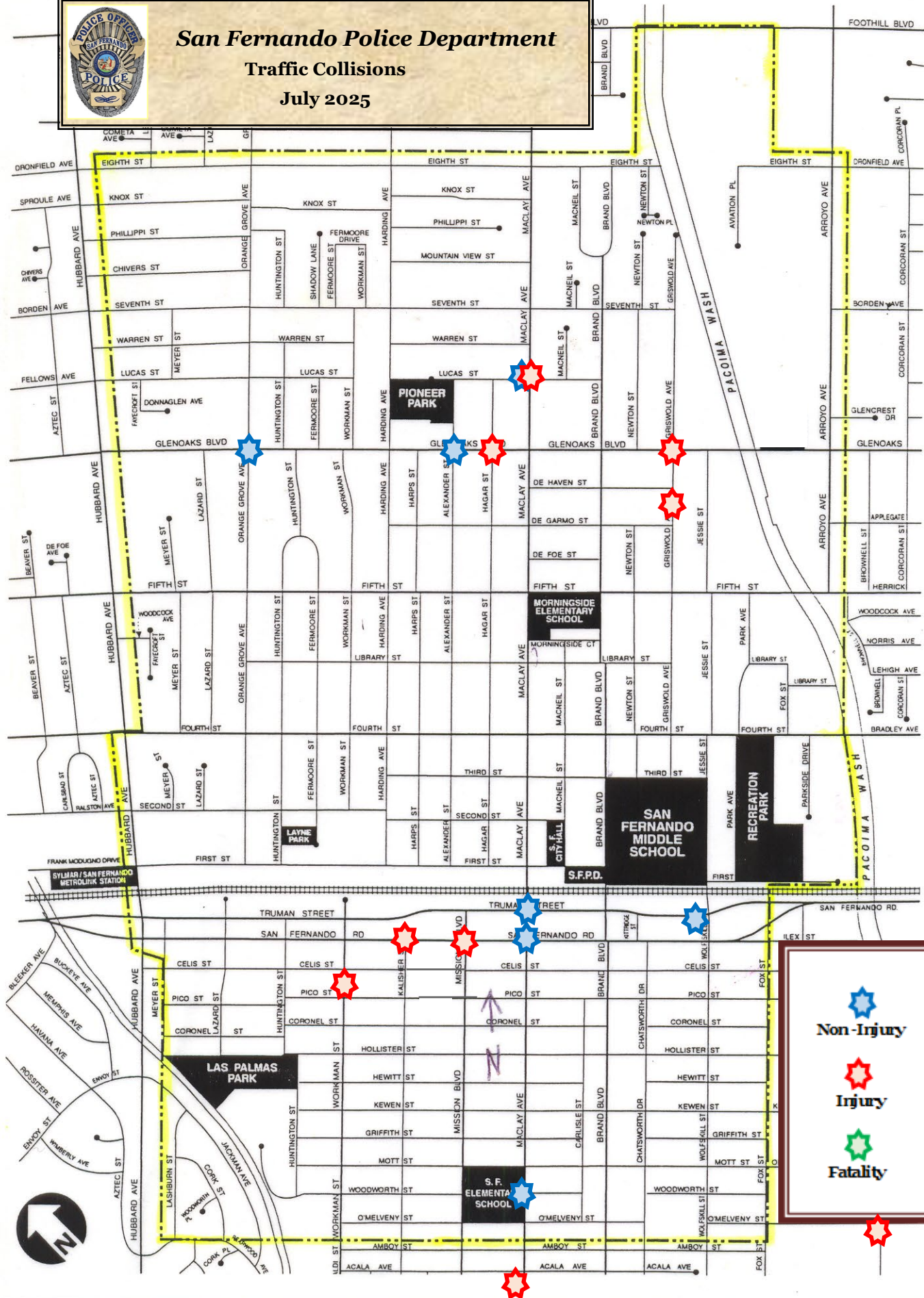
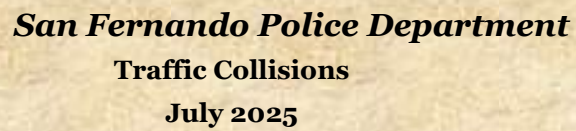
