Subject: October 2025 Notable Police Department Events and Activities

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Transportation and Public Safety (TPS) Commission receive and file this informational report.

BACKGROUND:

Each month at the City of San Fernando Transportation and Public Safety Commission meeting, the Police Department submits and provides the governing board a brief overview of the previous month's community engagement activities, noteworthy incidents, and proactive enforcement.

ANALYSIS:

The San Fernando Police Department (SFPD) has recently heightened and further integrated its community profile in three major areas: Community Engagement, Proactive Enforcement and Quality of Life Enhancements.

For the month of October 2025, the SFPD has the following activities and incidents to report:

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT:

1. National Night Out

On Tuesday, October 7, 2025, SFPD hosted its Annual National Night Out and Open House. The event featured guided tours of the Police Station with demonstrations on forensics and police equipment, K9 demonstrations, demonstrations of felony traffic stops, and informational booths from various community organizations.

2. ABC Grant IMPACT Inspections

On Tuesday, October 14, 2025, SFPD Detectives, in partnership with an Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC) agent, conducted Informed Merchants Preventing Alcohol-Related Crime Tendencies (IMPACT) inspections at ten off-sale ABC-licensed establishments throughout the

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City. The inspections were funded through the Department's 2025-2026 ABC Alcohol Policing Partnership (APP) Grant. No citations were issued.

3. Ribbon-Cutting Ceremony

On Thursday, October 16, 2025, Chief Valdez attended a joint ribbon-cutting ceremony hosted by the Mexican Consulate, City of San Fernando, and the County of Los Angeles.

4. Meeting with LAUSD and LAUSD School Police Department

On Wednesday, October 22, 2025, SFPD personnel met with representatives from the Los Angeles Unified School District (LAUSD) and the LAUSD Police Department to review and clarify each agency's roles and responsibilities.

5. Dia de los Muertos Celebration

On Saturday, October 25, 2025, Chief Valdez attended the Dia de los Muertos Celebration at Recreation Park.

NOTEWORTHY EVENTS:

1. Friday, October 3, 2025, at approximately 10:30 AM, SFPD officers responded to a report of a man armed with a knife threatening his mother at a residence in the 2000 block of Warren Street. Upon arrival, officers heard screams for help coming from inside the home. They entered the residence and arrested a male subject for assault with a deadly weapon.
2. On Friday, October 3, 2025, at about 8:00 PM, SFPD responded to a report from Target Loss Prevention of a shoplifting suspect in the 12900 block of Foothill Boulevard. The investigation revealed the suspect was involved in multiple thefts over the past month and conspired with another person to steal and return items for profit. The suspect was arrested for grand theft and organized retail theft.
3. On Saturday, October 4, 2025, at approximately 8:00 PM, an SFPD officer observed a bicyclist commit a traffic violation. The officer initiated a traffic stop and contacted the bicyclist, who was arrested for an outstanding warrant, possession of a controlled substance, and possession of methamphetamine.
4. On Sunday, October 5, 2025, at approximately 10:00 AM, SFPD officers received a Flock ALPR alert for a stolen vehicle in the 12900 block of Foothill Boulevard and conducted a traffic stop. The investigation revealed two stolen catalytic converters, burglary tools, and shaved keys inside the vehicle. The driver was arrested for multiple felony offenses, and the passenger was arrested on an outstanding domestic violence warrant.
5. On Sunday, October 5, 2025, at approximately 2:30 PM, SFPD officers received a Flock ALPR notification of a stolen vehicle in the area of San Fernando Road and Hubbard Avenue. They

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located the vehicle in the area of San Fernando Road and Desmond Street and conducted a traffic enforcement stop. Following an investigation, officers arrested a female subject for grand theft auto and outstanding warrants for petty theft and grand theft auto.

6. On Wednesday, October 8, 2025, at approximately 11:20 AM, an SFPD officer located a vehicle from a Flock ALPR notification in the area of Hubbard Street and Borden Street and conducted a traffic enforcement stop. One adult was arrested for taking or driving a vehicle without the owner's consent, and two other adults were arrested for drug-related offenses.
7. On Thursday, October 9, 2025 around 3:50 AM, SFPD officers responded to multiple reports of an explosion and house fire in the 500 block of Fermore Street. Officers located a vehicle fire that had spread to nearby trees, downed a power line, and threatened the residence. LAFD responded and extinguished the fire.
8. On Friday, October 10, 2025, at about 8:00 PM, SFPD officers responded to a report of a domestic violence in progress in the 1300 block of Mott Street. A male subject was arrested for domestic violence with injuries and child endangerment.
9. On Sunday, October 12, 2025, at approximately 1:00 AM, an SFPD officer observed a vehicle commit multiple traffic violations near Meyer Street and Truman Street. The officer conducted a traffic stop and learned the driver was on post-release community supervision for robbery. After a probation compliance search, the driver was arrested for possession of cocaine and driving with a suspended license.
10. On Sunday, October 12, 2025, around 1:50 AM, an SFPD officer stopped a male bicyclist without lights near Truman Street and Hubbard Avenue. The subject admitted to possessing methamphetamine and a pipe. He was arrested for drug possession, paraphernalia, prior drug convictions, and an outstanding warrant.
11. On Monday, October 13, 2025, at about 1:45 AM, an SFPD officer observed a subject clearing trash from his vehicle and littering it in a public parking lot near Celis Street. The officer contacted the subject and learned that he had multiple outstanding warrants, including one from the San Fernando Court. The subject was arrested for the outstanding warrant.
12. On Monday, October 13, 2025, at approximately 10:45 AM, SFPD officers received a Flock ALPR notification of a stolen vehicle traveling Southbound on Arroyo Avenue from Eighth Street. The vehicle stopped in the area of Alexander Street and De Garmo Avenue, where the driver exited the vehicle, was detained, and arrested for driving a stolen vehicle.
13. On Tuesday, October 14, 2025, around 6:45 PM, an SFPD officer responded to a report of shoplifting in progress in the 12900 block of Foothill Boulevard (Target). Two female subjects were arrested for shoplifting.

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14. On Friday, October 17, 2025, at approximately 3:10 AM, an SFPD officer observed a male subject riding his bicycle without lights. The officer conducted a pedestrian stop of the bicyclist and learned that the subject had an outstanding warrant for identity theft. The bicyclist was arrested for the outstanding warrant.
15. On Friday, October 17, 2025, at about 7:30 PM, SFPD officers responded to a Flock ALPR notification of a stolen vehicle near Truman Street and Hubbard Avenue. Officers located the vehicle, conducted a traffic stop, and arrested the driver for taking or driving a vehicle without the owner's consent, possession of methamphetamine, possession of drug paraphernalia, and prior narcotics convictions.
16. On Saturday, October 18, 2025, around 6:05 PM, SFPD officers responded to a report of a male subject lying down in protest and refusing to leave a private event in the 400 block of Park Avenue. The subject was arrested for trespassing.
17. On Saturday, October 18, 2025, at approximately 8:45 PM, an SFPD officer observed a vehicle commit a traffic violation in the area of Griffith Street and San Fernando Mission Boulevard. The officer conducted a traffic enforcement stop and contacted the driver. Following an investigation, the driver was arrested for driving with a suspended license and two outstanding warrants.
18. On Tuesday, October 21, 2025, at about 6:20 PM, SFPD officers responded to a report of a possible vehicle burglary in the 300 block of San Fernando Mission Boulevard. Officers contacted the subjects and observed drugs and paraphernalia inside the vehicle. One subject was arrested for possession of a controlled substance, possession of drug paraphernalia, and unlawful possession or sale of sedatives.
