**Subject:** November 2025 Notable Police Department Events and Activities

### **RECOMMENDATION:**

It is recommended that the Transportation and Public Safety (TPS) Commission receive and file this informational report.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

Each month at the City of San Fernando Transportation and Public Safety Commission meeting, the Police Department submits and provides the governing board a brief overview of the previous month's community engagement activities, noteworthy incidents, and proactive enforcement.

### **ANALYSIS:**

The San Fernando Police Department (SFPD) has recently heightened and further integrated its community profile in three major areas: Community Engagement, Proactive Enforcement and Quality of Life Enhancements.

For the month of November 2025, the SFPD has the following activities and incidents to report:

### **COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT:**

### 1. SFPD/LA County Probation Compliance Check

On Monday, November 10, 2025, from 4:00 PM to 9:00 PM. SFPD detectives and officers, along with an LA County Probation Officer, conducted a probation compliance check. The operation resulted in the arrest of a male subject for being a felon in possession of ammunition and for probation violations.

### 2. Veterans Day Parade

On Tuesday, November 11, 2025, from 10:00 AM to 12:30 PM, SFPD Commander Chiasson, Sergeant Dominguez, and Officer Gallegos participated in the Veterans Day Parade.

### 3. ABC Alcohol Policing Partnership (APP) Grant – IMPACT Inspections

On Tuesday, November 18, 2025, SFPD personnel conducted Informed Merchants Preventing Alcohol-Related Crime Tendencies (IMPACT) inspections as part of the Department's 2025–2026 ABC Alcohol Policing Partnership Grant. IMPACT is a prevention and education program developed by ABC that applies a community-oriented policing approach, working directly with local alcohol merchants to promote compliance and reduce alcohol-related crime. Detectives and an ABC representative visited eight establishments. No criminal citations were issued.

#### **NOTEWORTHY EVENTS:**

- 1. Saturday, November 1, 2025, around 1:40 AM, SFPD officers responded to a report of two subjects looking into a closed business in the 1400 block of Truman Street. Officers contacted a male and female subject. During the encounter, the male swallowed an unknown object and attempted to discard a methamphetamine pipe in the gutter. He was arrested for possession of drug paraphernalia, cited, and released.
- 2. Saturday, November 1, 2025, at approximately 5:30 AM, SFPD officers responded to a report of a male subject attempting to set fire to Morningside Elementary School at 576 North Maclay Avenue. Officers observed a freshly burnt wall on a campus building and a male subject standing between two bungalows. The subject, who had used an acetylene torch to cut several electrical junction boxes to steal copper wiring, fled on foot but was apprehended and arrested for burglary, attempted grand theft, felony vandalism, trespassing, resisting arrest, and possession of drug paraphernalia.
- 3. Friday, November 7, 2025, at approximately 1:35 PM, SFPD officers responded to a report of trespassing in the 100 block of Hubbard Street. Following an investigation, they arrested a male subject for possession of drug paraphernalia.
- 4. Friday, November 7, 2025, around 4:30 PM, SFPD officers conducted a traffic enforcement stop near San Fernando Road and Celis Street. An adult male was arrested for possession of brass knuckles, methamphetamine, and drug paraphernalia.
- 5. Friday, November 7, 2025, at about 10:00 PM, an SFPD officer contacted a male and female inside a vehicle with an expired registration. The male subject had an outstanding warrant for battery and was arrested.
- 6. Sunday, November 9, 2025, at approximately 3:10 PM, an SFPD officer responded to a report of a shoplifting suspect in custody at Home Depot in the 12900 block of Foothill Boulevard. Following an investigation, the officer arrested the subject for shoplifting.

- 7. Monday, November 10, 2025, at about 10:00 AM, an SFPD officer responded to a report of a restraining order violation in the 700 block of South Huntington Street. The officer contacted the restrained subject, who was parked outside the residence, and arrested him for violating a restraining order.
- 8. Thursday, November 13, 2025, around 9:50 AM, SFPD officers responded to a report of a man threatening another man with a knife. Following an investigation, officers arrested a male subject for brandishing a weapon or a firearm.
- 9. Thursday, November 13, 2025, at approximately 8:40 PM, SFPD officers responded to a report of a domestic dispute in the 1200 block of Mott Street. A female subject was arrested for domestic battery.
- 10. Saturday, November 15, 2025, at about 7:00 PM, SFPD officers responded to a report of an assault with a deadly weapon in the 100 block of Harding Avenue. A male subject, who was under the influence, assaulted a victim and left the scene. Officers located the subject, conducted a traffic stop of the subject, arrested him for assault with a deadly weapon, child endangerment, driving under the influence, and for having a fourth or subsequent DUI offense within 10 years.
- 11. Sunday, November 16, 2025, around 2:40 PM, SFPD officers received a Flock ALPR notification of a stolen vehicle in the 12900 block of Foothill Boulevard. They located the vehicle and arrested a male subject for driving a vehicle without the owner's consent and a Post-Release Community Supervision violation.
- 12. Sunday, November 16, 2025, at approximately 11:45 PM, SFPD officers responded to a report of a male subject causing a disturbance in the 1000 block of Truman Street. They arrested the subject for public intoxication and resisting arrest.
- 13. Monday, November 17, 2025, around 9:50 AM, an SFPD officer conducted a traffic enforcement stop in the area of Laurel Canyon Boulevard and Rinaldi Street. He arrested a male subject for possession of brass knuckles and driving without a valid license.
- 14. Sunday, November 16, 2025, and Monday, November 17, 2025, SFPD officers responded to reports of multiple residential burglaries at a vacant home in the 1600 block of Knox Street. Over a three-day period, the residence had been burglarized several times. Officers identified a suspect vehicle and, using the Flock ALPR system, located it in the area of Glenoaks Boulevard and Harding Avenue on Tuesday, November 19, 2025, around 11:00 AM. They conducted a traffic stop and, following an investigation, arrested a male subject for burglary and returned the stolen property to the victims.
