<p>SCAN ME</p> 	<p><u>Gerry's Kids Scholarship</u></p> <p>This \$1,500 essay scholarship awarded annually is funded by Timothy Hou, a former Deputy City Manager and Director of Community Development at City of San Fernando, and his family in memory of Gerry and her work with students.</p>
<p>SCAN ME</p> 	<p><u>Republic Services - Cesar Chavez Scholarship</u></p> <p>Republic Services will award one (1) \$1,000 scholarship to City of San Fernando resident high school senior for the 2026 Annual Cesar Chavez Scholarship Program. Only college-bound high school seniors living within the City of San Fernando are eligible.</p>
<p>SCAN ME</p> 	<p><u>Heartbloom Scholarship</u></p> <p>One \$500 scholarship will be awarded this year. This scholarship is open to any student who will this academic year or has in a previous year received a high school completion certificate or a diploma via successful passage of the California Alternate Assessments, who is pursuing further education, training, or mentorship in the visual arts.</p>

<p>SCAN ME</p> 	<p><u>Elias Rodriguez Memorial Scholarship</u></p> <p>One scholarship for \$500 will be awarded this year. This opportunity is open to any graduating college-bound high school senior or current full-time student enrolled in a community college or four-year university.</p>
<p>SCAN ME</p> 	<p><u>Pahola Mascorro – Why Not You? Scholarship</u></p> <p>The commission will award one (1) \$500 scholarship to a student that may not have had traditional academic success in high school. This opportunity is open to a high school senior that has below a 3.0 GPA (C average or below) and plans to attend college.</p>
<p>SCAN ME</p> 	<p><u>Beyond the Bachelor's Scholarship</u></p> <p>One (1) \$500 scholarship will be awarded to a postbaccalaureate student who currently lives in the City of San Fernando, graduated from a high school in the City of San Fernando, or currently works for the City of San Fernando.</p>
<p>SCAN ME</p> 	<p><u>Unheard Voices Scholarship</u></p> <p>This scholarship sponsored by Councilmember Joel Fajardo and other donors is open to college-bound high school seniors and current undergraduate students.</p> <p>One (1) \$500 scholarship will be awarded to a student who currently lives in the City of San Fernando, or attends (or graduated from) a high school in the City of San Fernando.</p>
